Relative to recognizing and commending Ms. Rose "Kitty" Simonds for her extensive and continued service to the Western Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Council.

- 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN
- 2 GUÅHAN:
- 3 WHEREAS, the Western Pacific Regional Fisheries Management
- 4 Council (Council) was established as one (1) of eight (8) regional councils to

- 1 the Magnuson Fisheries Conservation and Management Act in 1976 to
- 2 develop fishery management plans for fisheries operating in the US
- 3 exclusive economic zone (EEZ) around American Samoa, the
- 4 Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, Hawaii, and the
- 5 other U.S. Pacific Islands, including Howland Island, Baker Island, Jarvis
- 6 Island, Johnston Atoll, Midway Island, Kingman Reef Palmyra Atoll and
- 7 Wake Island; and
- 8 WHEREAS, with approximately 1.5 million square miles under its
- 9 jurisdiction, the Council develops and recommends fisheries management
- 10 policies for approximately fifty (50%) percent of the oceans under U.S.
- 11 control for the review by the National Oceanic and Atmospheric
- 12 Administration National Marine Fisheries Service, and transmitted to the
- 13 U.S. Secretary of Commerce for approval; and
- 14 WHEREAS, the Council is comprised of sixteen (16) Council
- 15 Members, two (2) each from American Samoa, the Commonwealth of the
- 16 Northern Marianas Islands, Guam and Hawaii as well as four (4) at-large
- 17 members, all nominated by the Governors of each jurisdiction and
- 18 appointed by the Secretary of the Department of Commerce, plus one (1)
- 19 representative each from the Pacific Island Regional Office of the National
- 20 Marine Fisheries Service, the U.S. Coast Guard Fourteenth (14th) District,
- 21 the U.S. Fish & Wildlife, and the U.S. Department of State; and

**WHEREAS**, Kitty Simonds, after a stint serving as an aide to Senator

2 Hiram Fong, Hawaii's first member of Congress, has served the Western

3 Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Council since its creation in 1976 as

4 Executive Director, giving her the distinction of being the longest-serving

5 employee of any Council; and

WHEREAS, Kitty Simonds has encouraged the stakeholders of the various island communities to participate in the Council's advisory panels and fisheries meetings to ensure that their valuable input on pertinent issues is heard; and

WHEREAS, Kitty Simonds has managed her staff of educated and talented individuals to assist in providing the Council Members the most up-to-date information, and to ensure that Council decisions are based on the best available scientific information provided largely by the Pacific Islands Fisheries Science Center and the Pelagic Fisheries Research Program; and

WHEREAS, Kitty Simonds has provided the staff with the leadership and due diligence that has paved the way for the Council's accomplishments, which include being the first Regional Fisheries Management Council in the Nation to prohibit drift gill-net fishing and bottom-trawling, to develop an ecosystem-based fisheries management plan, and to being the pioneer of the vessel monitoring system (VMS) for

- 1 fishing vessels, which is now being implemented in fisheries worldwide;
- 2 and
- 3 WHEREAS, management measures created by the Council and
- 4 approved by the Secretary are implemented by the National Marine
- 5 Fisheries Service (NMFS) Pacific Islands Regional Office, and enforced by
- 6 the NOAA Office of Law Enforcement, the U.S. Coast Guard 14th District
- 7 and local enforcement agencies; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Kitty Simonds has been able to balance her
- 9 responsibilities as the Executive Director of the Council, with her
- 10 responsibilities at home, being married to John Simonds and having raised
- 11 two (2) children, Malia and Max; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Kitty Simond's work with the Council over the last
- thirty-four (34) years has improved the management of fisheries within the
- 14 U.S. exclusive economic zone within the Pacific Region; now, therefore, be
- 15 it
- RESOLVED, that I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby,
- on behalf of the people of Guam, extend its most heartfelt gratitude to Rose
- 18 "Kitty" Simonds for her outstanding dedication and continuous service to
- 19 the people of Guam, the U.S. Pacific Islands, the Council, and the Nation;

- 21 of the Western Pacific Regional Fisheries Management Council; and be it
