Commission on the celebration of their Fifth (5th) Anniversary, and to commending its Board of Commissioners and staff, the Guam Department of **AmeriCorps** the the Labor, Programs, Guam **AmeriCorps** Alumni Chapter, the Guam AmeriCorps*VISTA, and the Guåhan Volunteer Center, in partnership with the University of Guam, for their continued service for our island.

IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I 1 MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- WHEREAS, on June 2, 2005, through Executive Order No. 2005-22, I 3
- 4 Maga'lahen Guåhan established the Commission on National and Community
- 5 Service, now known as the Serve Guam! Commission, and on June 30, 2005, I
- 6 Maga'lahen Guåhan appointed fourteen (14) commissioners to guide Guam and
- 7 the Commission in community service efforts; and

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- 8 WHEREAS, the Governor's Serve Guåhan! Commission and the
- Corporation for National and Community Service Act of 1990 provide grants 9
- to establish programs that improve lives, strengthen communities, and foster 10
- civic engagement through service and volunteering; and to operate and 11
- 12 expand national service programs, such as AmeriCorps, that provide training
- and technical assistance to national service programs; and 13
- 14 WHEREAS, the Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act was signed by
- President Barack Obama on April 21, 2009, which put the expansion of 15
- national service on the path to grow to two hundred fifty thousand (250,000) 16
- positions by 2017, thereby increasing service opportunities for students and 17
- older Americans, to focus service on key national priorities, and to increase 18
- efficiency and accountability; and 19
- 20 WHEREAS, the Governor's Serve Guåhan! Commission continues to
- successfully establish and implement three (3) national programs and the 21

- 1 Guåhan Volunteer Center since the establishment of the Serve Guåhan!
- 2 Commission in 2005; and
- 3 WHEREAS, on August 28, 2008, the Governor's Guåhan Volunteer
- 4 Center was established in partnership with the University of Guam, and its
- 5 President, Dr. Robert A. Underwood; and
- 6 WHEREAS, on February 3, 2009, the Guam AmeriCorps Alumni
- 7 Chapter was established to advance the Governor's strategic plan and to make
- 8 a difference in our island community by inspiring national service alumni,
- 9 mobilizing for change, and to continue the mission of AmeriCorps programs
- 10 to serve the community through its alumni and national chapter, and in
- 11 partnership with community organizations, non-profits, faith-based groups,
- 12 businesses, government and federal agencies; and.
- 13 WHEREAS, on May 4, 2010, the Guam AmeriCorps*VISTA was
- 14 established and it recruited two (2) members to specifically fight poverty.
- 15 Founded as Volunteers in Service to America in 1965, and incorporated into
- 16 the AmeriCorps network of programs in 1993, VISTA has been on the front
- 17 lines in the fight against poverty in America for more than forty (40) years;
- 18 and
- 19 **WHEREAS**, the Governor's Serve *Guåhan!* Commission and the *Guåhan*
- 20 Department of Labor "Navigator" will conduct an outreach to the disability
- 21 community, and the organizations that serve them, and will provide
- 22 assistance, expertise and information on SSA work incentives and

1 employment support programs on navigating through the variety of

2 programs and services that impact their employment (e.g., transportation,

housing, health care, etc.), under the One-Stop Center; and

WHEREAS, the Serve *Guåhan!* Commission promotes service for young people and advocates for youth; it champions the efforts to help young people make informed and responsible decisions, and to put them on the path to a lifetime of service; and it uses its domestic and international work for learning and disseminating lessons across borders; and

WHEREAS, the Serve *Guåhan!* Commission will build on its success from the President's and the Governor's call to service over the coming years to focus on guiding principles, such as: service as a solution in identifying and targeting resources to tackle issues, and to better demonstrate impact; expand opportunities to serve in connecting with our island citizens and provide easy access to service opportunities to fit their needs and engage them in a lifetime of service; build enduring capacity to enable individuals, organizations and communities to become more effective in addressing pressing challenges and to use service as a lasting solution; embrace innovation and invest in models that work, find new ways of doing business, and serve as a source of ideas for local communities; now, therefore, be it
