Relative to recognizing and commending Lt. Commander Matthew Salas and the crew of the United States Coast Guard Cutter Sequoia for their efforts in preventing the illegal trafficking of one (1) metric ton of cocaine.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN: WHEREAS, for over two (2) centuries the United States Coast Guard

- 4 has safeguarded our Nation's maritime interests in the heartland, in the ports,
- 5 at sea, and around the globe; and
- WHEREAS, today's U.S. Coast Guard, with nearly forty-two thousand (42,000) men and women on active duty, is a unique force that carries out an array of civil and military responsibilities touching almost every facet of the
- 9 U.S. maritime environment; and
- WHEREAS, in December 2009, the U.S. Coast Guard Cutter Sequoia, home ported in Apra Harbor, Guam, interdicted Hong Kong's King Yue 1, a vessel on the high seas with no identifiable markings, which was suspected of transporting cocaine from South America to China; and
- WHEREAS, the Sequoia tracked the vessel for seventeen (17) days through the Philippine Sea, from Micronesia to the South China Sea near Hong Kong; and
- WHEREAS, as the Sequoia tracked the vessel, authorities from the Drug
  Enforcement Agency, the Department of State, the Department of Justice, the
  Coast Guard and the U.S. Embassy in Beijing coordinated with the People's
  Republic of China to board the vessel and seize any contraband; and
- WHEREAS, prior to being boarded by two (2) Chinese Coast Guard vessels, the crew of the King Yue 1 dumped approximately two thousand

- 1 (2,000) pounds of cocaine overboard. The crew of the King Yue 1 were
- 2 arrested and brought to Hong Kong; and
- WHEREAS, the Sequoia crew's work prevented the landing of one (1)
- 4 metric ton of cocaine ashore; and
- 5 WHEREAS, the Drug Enforcement Administration presented a
- 6 Certificate of Appreciation to the crew of the Sequoia for their outstanding
- 7 contributions in the field of drug law enforcement; and
- 8 **WHEREAS**, the crew of the Sequoia, a two hundred twenty-five (225)-
- 9 foot buoy tender with a crew of fifty (50), routinely carries out the Coast
- 10 Guard's missions of law enforcement, maritime safety, maritime mobility,
- 11 environmental protection and national defense, with an area of operation that
- 12 spans the Commonwealth of Northern Mariana Islands, Guam, Micronesia,
- 13 and the Marshall Islands; now, therefore, be it
- RESOLVED, that I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on
- 15 behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend Lt. Commander
- 16 Matthew Salas, and the crew of the United States Coast Guard Cutter Sequoia,
- 17 for their actions in preventing the illegal trafficking of one (1) metric ton of
- 18 cocaine; and be it further
- 19 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative Secretary
- 20 attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter
- 21 transmitted to Lt. Commander Matthew Salas, Commanding Officer, and the
- crew of the United States Coast Guard Cutter Sequoia; to Admiral Robert J.

- 1 Papp, Jr., Commandant of the United States Coast Guard; to the Honorable
- 2 Madeleine Z. Bordallo, Guam's Delegate to the United States Congress; and to
- 3 the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, I Maga'lahen Guåhan.
