WHEREAS, the Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act was signed by
President Barack Obama on April 21, 2009, which put the expansion of
national service on the path to grow to two hundred fifty thousand (250,000)
positions by 2017, thereby increasing service opportunities for students and
older Americans, to focus service on key national priorities, and to increase
efficiency and accountability; and

WHEREAS, the Governor's Serve *Guahan!* Commission continues to successfully establish and implement three (3) national programs and the *Guåhan* Volunteer Center, since the establishment of the Serve *Guahan!* Commission in 2005; and

WHEREAS, on August 28, 2008, the Governor's *Guahan* Volunteer Center was established, in partnership with the University of *Guahan*, and its President, Dr. Robert A. Underwood; and

WHEREAS, on February 3, 2009, the *Guåhan* AmeriCorps Alumni Chapter was established to advance the Governor's strategic plan, and to make a difference in our island community by inspiring national service alumni, mobilizing for change, and to continue the mission of AmeriCorps programs to serve the community through its alumni and national chapter,

WHEREAS, on May 4, 2010, the *Guåhan* AmeriCorps*VISTA was established, and it recruited two (2) members to specifically fight poverty. Founded as Volunteers in Service to America in 1965, and incorporated into the AmeriCorps network of programs in 1993, VISTA has been on the front lines in the fight against poverty in America for more than forty (40) years;

WHEREAS, the Governor's Serve *Guåhan!* Commission, the *Guåhan* Department of Labor, and the University of Massachusetts Boston will conduct training and technical assistance presentations on the Edward M. Kennedy Serve America Act for organizations that serve Guam's disability community, providing assistance, expertise and information on the expansion, disability inclusion, innovation and impact for the service, and volunteerism; and

WHEREAS, the Serve *Guåhan!* Commission promotes service for young people and advocates for youth; it champions the efforts to help young people make informed and responsible decisions, and to put them on the path to a lifetime of service; and it uses its domestic and international work for learning and disseminating lessons across borders; and

WHEREAS, the Serve *Guåhan!* Commission will build on its success from the President's and the Governor's call to service over the coming years

to focus on guiding principles, such as: service as a solution in identifying and 1 2 targeting resources to tackle issues, and to better demonstrate impact; expand 3 opportunities to serve in connecting with our island citizens and provide easy 4 access to service opportunities to fit their needs and engage them in a lifetime of service; build enduring capacity to enable individuals, organizations and 5 communities to become more effective in addressing pressing challenges and 6 7 to use service as a lasting solution; embrace innovation and invest in models that work, find new ways of doing business, and serve as a source of ideas for 8 9 local communities; now, therefore, be it
