Relative to recognizing and memorializing the late Reverend Daniel Cristobal, OFM Cap., the first Chamorro Capuchin Priest, for his invaluable contributions and service to the people of Guam; and to extending sincere condolences to his family and his brother Capuchins on his passing.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, *Próspero Policárpo* Untalan Cristobal, son of the late Adriano and Carmen Untalan Cristobal, was born in 1931 in *Hagåtña*, Guam, and was called to his eternal reward on Sunday, August 15, 2010, at the venerable age of seventy-nine (79) years; and

WHEREAS, prior to World War II, *Próspero* attended Guam [Elementary] Institute, Agaña Post Office School and Government School. Following the war, he attended *Sinajaña* Elementary School, and George Washington High School in *Agaña*; and he was among the first student body of Father Duenas Memorial High School in *Ta'i*, *Mangilao*, graduating in 1952; and

WHEREAS, the following September, *Próspero* entered the novitiate of the newly established Province of St. Mary in Milton, Maryland, and was invested in 1952, receiving the religious name "Daniel," and professing his vows a year later. He began his philosophical studies at Mary Immaculate Friary in Garrison, New York, graduating in 1955; and

WHEREAS, Daniel continued his theological studies in Garrison, and completed his theological requirements in 1959. Father Daniel was ordained by the Most Reverend Apollinaris W. Baumgartner, OFM Cap, Vicar Apostolic of the Mariana Islands, in the same year at the *Dulce Nombre de Maria Cathedral* in *Agaña*. He later proved himself to be a talented minister, as

he served in a variety of apostolate and parochial settings; and

WHEREAS, Father Daniel first ministered at his alma mater, Father 1 Dueñas Memorial High School, as an instructor until 1961, and again from 2 1964 to 1966. After a short period of ministerial assistance in Saipan, he served 3 4 as an Assistant Pastor at St. Francis Church in Yona, and Santa Barbara in Dededo. He later ministered as the Pastor of San Miguel in Talofofo, and then 5 6 served once again at Santa Barbara in *Dededo*, and St. Francis in *Yona*; and 7 WHEREAS, in 1985, Father Daniel was appointed as the Pastor of St. Jude Thaddeus Church in Sinajaña, and served there until 1994. During this 8 9 time, Father Daniel was once again called upon to lead the Guam pilgrimage to Rome to attend the beatification of Blessed Diego Luis de San Vitores, a 10 11 Spanish Jesuit missionary who founded the first Catholic Church on the island of Guam. Venerable Diego was responsible for establishing the Catholic 12 Church's presence in the Mariana Islands; and 13 WHEREAS, throughout his priestly life, as early as 1961, Father Daniel 14 been a dedicated spiritual advisor to the Secular Franciscan 15 community, and he was instrumental in establishing several fraternities on 16 Guam. While residing with the Friar community of St. Fidelis in Agaña, 17 18 Daniel served as the Director of Secular Franciscans and the Cursillo Movement for the island; and 19 20 WHEREAS, Father Daniel was also active in the on-going development of the Christian Mothers Society. In 1975, Father Daniel was appointed by 21 22 Bishop Flores to coordinate all the Holy Year Diocesan Events, including a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. In later years, because of his successful 23

1 organizational abilities, he would again receive several diocesan 2 appointments to chair diocesan committees; and

WHEREAS, while serving as the Pastor of Santa Rita, Father Daniel was appointed to chair the monumental task of organizing all the church preparations for the historic visit of the Venerable Pope John Paul II to Guam in 1981. After serving in Santa Rita, Father Daniel served as Pastor of Our Lady of Peace and Safe Voyage in *Chalan Pago* until 2001 when, at the age of seventy (70) years, he was appointed as Pastor of the San Miguel parish in *Talofofo*. While there, he served the people faithfully until the end of 2009, when his health declined rather quickly, and he then retired to the St. Fidelis Friary in *Agaña Heights*; and

WHEREAS, after struggling for ten (10) months from the effects of a congestive heart failure and a stroke that he experienced just two (2) weeks before his death, he very peacefully breathed his last breath on the 15th of August, 2010, the Feast of the Assumption of Our Lady; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and memorialize the late Fr. Daniel Cristobal, OFM Cap.; for his outstanding contributions, legacy and services to the religious faithful of Guam and Saipan; and does extend sincere condolences to his family and the Capuchin Friars of Guam. Father Daniel, we thank you for your willingness to serve wherever you were sent in your fifty-one (51) years as a Priest, and for sharing your talents and your

- spirituality with the people of the Diocese of Chalan Kanoa and the 1
- Archdiocese of *Agana*; and be it further 2
