Relative to recognizing and congratulating Mr. Seiji Sato for his thirty-seven (37) years of exemplary service to Guam's Tourism Industry; to *expressing Un Dangkulo Na Si Yu'us Ma'ase* to him for his invaluable contributions to Guam; and to extending best wishes to him on his retirement, on behalf of the people of Guam. 1 BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA' TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN 2 GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Mr. Seiji Sato began his illustrious career in the tourism
industry in 1973, working in the Overseas Travel Branch of the Japan
Travel Bureau; and

6 WHEREAS, his industriousness and foresight brought him to the 7 *Mariana Islands* in 1982, when tourism was a burgeoning industry, on the 8 cusp of full bloom; and

9 WHEREAS, as a young manager in the newly-established Guam 10 branch of the Japan Travel Bureau, Mr. Sato quickly established rapport 11 and garnered support from the local community, and members of the 12 hospitality industry, to enhance the tour experience of the visitors to our 13 island; and

WHEREAS, he was instrumental in the successful development and expansion of the Guam branch of the Japan Travel Bureau, which went from operating out of a cluster of small offices at the Hilton Guam Hotel to becoming a full-fledged transportation company, which was later named *Lam Lam* Tours & Transportation, Inc., and also a full-service travel agent company, Pacific Micronesia Tours, Guam; and

WHEREAS, when Mr. Sato returned to Japan from his Guam assignment, he cherished and nurtured the many friendships he had made through his business activities, supporting travel to Guam and the Northern Marianas from his Pacific Micronesia Tours Office in Tokyo; and

1 WHEREAS, he personally led familiarization tours to Guam and 2 Saipan on several occasions, sharing his knowledge of *Chamorro* culture 3 and business practices with his colleagues, and forging even greater 4 relationships and ventures; and

5 WHEREAS, Mr. Sato's experience and accomplishments in the 6 *Mariana Islands* brought him back to this region in 2005, where he served as 7 the Saipan Branch Manager of Pacific Micronesia Tours, as well as 8 President of TASI Tours; and

9 WHEREAS, upon moving back to the *Marianas* from Tokyo, he 10 immersed himself in the affairs of the local community with the objective 11 of enhancing the quality of life in the islands, as well as the tourism 12 industry, while serving as a Member of the Marianas Visitors Authority 13 Board of Directors; as a Member the Rotary Club; as the Vice Chairman of 14 the Japan Saipan Travel Association; and as the Chairman of the Japan 15 Business Executive Committee; and

16 WHEREAS, Mr. Sato's dedication to the travel industry and his 17 understanding of the need for authentic cultural experiences in a quality 18 destination tour inspired his development of the *"Taste of Marianas"* 19 Package Tour, which brought visitors and locals together for cultural 20 exposure, and bestowed upon the residents of Saipan a sense of 21 stewardship over their island and their tourism industry; and

WHEREAS, Mr. Sato returned to Guam in April 2008 to work as the
new President of Lam Lam Tours and Transportation; and

1 WHEREAS, after being away from Guam for twenty-seven (27) 2 years, he affected significant improvements in the services provided to our 3 visitors, including a tremendous overhaul of the feel of the transportation 4 services, and providing increased opportunities for employee education 5 and skills enhancement training; and

6 WHEREAS, Mr. Sato's innovative and long-term vision led to 7 relationships with the University of Guam and the Guam Community 8 College that yielded an outreach training program, wherein students of 9 tourism practice their skills in real-world settings as interns; and

WHEREAS, he continues to participate in community activities that improve the image of the island as a travel destination, including the formation of the Japan Guam Travel Association Bus Transportation Subcommittee, whose principal goal is to establish and maintain standard of quality services to visitors, and the Guam Island Fiesta Tour, which brought the maximum number of visitors to share in a uniquely *Chamorro* experience; and

WHEREAS, during Mr. Sato's thirty-seven (37) years with the Japan
 Travel Bureau, he has been instrumental in bringing approximately two
 hundred twenty-four thousand (224,000) Japanese visitors to Guam
 annually; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Mina' Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and commend Mr. Seiji Sato for his many achievements during his thirty-seven (37) years of exemplary
