Relative to recognizing and commending the members of the "Family Violence Awareness Month" Task Force, and Guam's practitioners and advocates, for their efforts in helping to raise awareness, and for their support of the victims of family violence, on the observance of the month of October 2010 as "Family Violence Awareness Month"; and to further extending our sincere gratitude to these individuals and organizations for the significant

## contributions they have made, and continue to make, to reduce the crime of family violence.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, family violence is physical, sexual, emotional or verbal violence directed against a person who is the abuser's intimate partner or relative, and affects people regardless of age, sexual orientation, physical ability, marital status, ethnicity, culture, education, religion, or economic status; and

WHEREAS, children in homes where abuse among adults occurs, are often neglected at a rate higher than the national average in the general public; and studies show that children from violent homes have a higher risk of alcohol or drug abuse and juvenile delinquency; they are six (6) times more likely to commit suicide; they are twenty-four (24) times more likely to commit sexual assault crimes; and they are fifty (50) times more likely to abuse drugs or alcohol; and

WHEREAS, children from abusive homes carry the terrible experiences of violence with them into adulthood, and into the next generation; and

WHEREAS, Guam Police Department statistics show family violencerelated offenses included two hundred four (204) cases of misdemeanor and felony family violence combined; five (5) cases of misdemeanor sexual assault; 1 fifty-two (52) cases of felony sexual assault with arrest of abuse and neglect

offenses against family and children; and two (2) deaths as a result of family

3 violence; and

WHEREAS, the Courts and Ministerial Division of the Superior Court of Guam reported four hundred seven (407) combined cases of felony and misdemeanor family violence; eighty-seven (87) combined cases of felony and misdemeanor criminal sexual conduct; and ninety-three (93) protection orders filings; and Probation Services Division reported six hundred ninety-nine (699) new family violence, sexual assault and child abuse cases, with nine hundred ninety-seven (997) defendants under supervision by the end of 2009; and

WHEREAS, Alee Shelter, Erica's House, the Public Defender Service Corporation and the Attorney General's Office have provided one thousand seven hundred thirty-five (1,735) victims with direct services, and have facilitated one hundred sixty-five (165) referrals to service providers; and

WHEREAS, family violence is often ignored and tolerated by our society, and many victims feel isolated, ashamed, and even responsible for the abuse, often blaming themselves; and

WHEREAS, many men and women are reluctant to admit to the incidence of family violence and are reluctant to seek help beyond their families, and some experts believe that the actual prevalence of family violence is much higher than the statistics indicate; and

1 WHEREAS, the Family Violence and Sexual Assault Task Force, STOP 2 VAW subgrantees, government and non-government organizations, faith-3 based organizations, and other community partners have joined forces to directly confront this crisis. They include: 4 Alee Shelter-Catholic Social Service; Andersen Family Support Services-Fleet & Family Support Services; 5 the Archdiocese of Agana; the Office of the Attorney General of Guam-Crime 6 7 Victim Response Unit; the Department of Corrections-Parole 8 Division/Training; the Department of Education; the Department of Mental 9 Health and Substance Abuse-Healing Hearts Crisis Center (HHCC); the Department of Public Health and Social Services; the Department of Youth 10 11 Erica's House-Visitation Center; the Governor's Community 12 Outreach-Federal Programs Office and the Governor's Legal Counsel; the Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority; I Liheslaturan Guåhan; the 13 14 Police Department-Victim Assistance Unit; Guma'Mami, Inc.; Inafa'Maolek; the Mayors Council of Guam; Guam's Media; Mothers Against 15 16 Drunk Driving (MADD); the Public Defender Service Corporation; the Guam 17 Judiciary - the Superior Court of Guam Client Services and Family 18 Counseling Division, the Judicial Council, and the Superior Court of Guam 19 Probation and Marshals Divisions; Sanctuary, Inc.; the University of Guam; 20 and the Victim Advocates Reaching Out (VARO); and

WHEREAS, the effort, compassion, and dedication of these volunteers, professionals, and organizations should be recognized and applauded; now,

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina' Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize and commend the members of the "Family Violence Awareness Month" Task Force, and Guam's practitioners and advocates, for their efforts in helping to raise awareness, and for their support of the victims of family violence, on the observance of the month of October 2010 as "Family Violence Awareness Month";, and does further extend much gratitude to these individuals and organizations for the significant contributions they have made, and continue to make, to reduce the crime of family violence; and be it further
