Relative to recognizing and honoring the seven (7) dedicated and courageous Veterans of the Republic of Korea (ROK) who served alongside the U.S. Military Forces during the Vietnam War for contributing their services and their sacrifices for liberty, and who now reside in our community as U.S. Citizens, and as contributing residents.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, although the United States was the main thrust in the Vietnam-Laos War, six (6) other nations and many indigenous peoples from the region assisted and fought alongside U.S. soldiers. One of those Allies was the Republic of Korea (ROK); and

WHEREAS, the Republic of Korea (ROK) deployed three hundred twenty-five thousand five hundred seventeen (325,517) combat troops to Vietnam between 1964 and 1973, in support of the American war effort in that country. The number of ROK combat troops was second only to the United States itself, and far exceeded all other Allied contributions combined; and

WHEREAS, ROK troops were in Vietnam since 1964, and at its peak in 1967, the ROK troop presence in Vietnam was just over fifty thousand (50,000). The last soldier left Saigon on March 23, 1973; and

WHEREAS, five thousand ninety-nine (5,099) ROK soldiers were killed, and ten thousand nine hundred sixty-two (10,962) were wounded; and

WHEREAS, the Korean troops were known throughout the conflict for their fierce combat skills, and the Korean units fought alongside American units in different areas of the theater, to include Binh Dinh, Quang Ngai, Phu Yen, Khanh Hoa, Saigon, Da Nang, Qui Nhon, Cam Ranh, Nha Trang, Ninh Hoa, Dien, Vung Tau, and the Quang Nam provinces, where each ROK unit was responsible for fighting the enemy by their own initiatives and decisions;

- 2 **WHEREAS**, according to the records, seven (7) ROK Vietnam veterans
- 3 have made Guam their home, and one thousand three hundred (1,300) are
- 4 estimated to live in the United States; and
