- WHEREAS, the late Greg B. Flores, a native son of Guam, was
- 4 born on November 9, 1958, one (1) of the seven (7) children of Jesse
- 5 Cruz Flores, a retired Navy Chief and former government of Guam
- 6 DOE Cafeteria Manager, and Rufina Delgado Borja Flores, a former
- 7 school teacher; and who was called from this life on December 14, 2010;
- 8 and
- 9 WHEREAS, growing up, Greg received almost all of his
- 10 education from the Guam educational system, as a student at Saint
- 11 Anthony School; Tamuning Elementary School; George Washington
- 12 Junior High School; the Guam Vocational Technical High School; John
- 13 F. Kennedy High School; and the University of Guam; and
- 14 WHEREAS, at the age of twelve (12) years old, during his junior
- 15 high school years, Greg nurtured his artistic gifts through
- 16 correspondence with successful commercial artist and cartoonist Leo
- 17 Stoutsenberger; and
- 18 WHEREAS, after graduating from high school, Greg continued in
- 19 his artistic pursuits, studying art history, drawing, watercolor, oil and
- 20 acrylic painting, and design at the University of Guam, while at the
- 21 same time working as a part-time employee with the advertising

- 1 departments of J&G's Town House Department Store and MVP's
- 2 Mark's and Ben Franklin Department Store; and
- 3 WHEREAS, in 1977, Greg started his professional career
- 4 when he completed his first commissioned work of art for the Odyssey
- 5 Night Club, and he introduced the air brush medium to Guam during
- 6 the mural's completion; and
- 7 WHEREAS, throughout his career, Greg was commissioned to
- 8 work on a number of significant projects, including murals for the A.B.
- 9 Won Pat International Airport at the request of the Guam Airport
- 10 Authority; the Governor's complex at Adelup at the request of the late
- 11 Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo; and the creation of a portrait of Prince
- 12 Leboo for the Republic of Palau's Prince Leboo Foundation; and
- WHEREAS, Greg had also used his considerable talent to serve
- 14 the Catholic Church by restoring paintings and statues, most notably at
- 15 the Saint Jude Thaddeus Church in *Sinajana*; the San Vitores Church in
- 16 Tumon; Our Lady of Peace and Safe Journey Church in Chalan Pago; Our
- 17 Lady of the Assumption Church in Piti; and the San Miguel Church in
- 18 Talofofo, as well as designing an historical mural for the Archbishop
- 19 Felixberto C. Flores Rotunda Circle; and
- WHEREAS, Greg was an enthusiastic participant in community
- 21 art events throughout the Mariana Islands, including the Guam Council
- 22 on the Arts and Humanities Agency's annual celebrations; the Annual

- 1 Guam/Micronesia Island Fair; the Annual Flame Tree Arts Festival in
- 2 Saipan; the 2008 Festival of Pacific Arts in American Samoa; as well as
- 3 the Guam Visitors Bureau's We Are Guam village mural project; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Greg was also recognized for the poignant political
- 5 satire in the Goro comic strip he created, that was published in
- 6 numerous island publications, including Hafa Magazine and Island
- 7 Beat; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Greg also followed an entrepreneurial vision and
- 9 started a number of businesses, including a tee-shirt printing service, a
- 10 sign and design service, as well as an airbrushed tee-shirt design shop
- at Gibson's Department Store and the Micronesia Mall; and
- 12 WHEREAS, the late Greg B. Flores is survived by his wife,
- 13 Maureen Borja Dondoyano; and his two (2) sons, Christopher, and
- 14 Derek and Joann Dondoyano; and Greg will also be greatly missed by
- 15 his grandson, Christopher Borja Dondoyano; now, therefore, be it

- 17 hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize and honor the late
