Relative to recognizing and commending Dr. Richard W. Fee for his dedicated service to students, families, and prospective teachers in Special Education in the island of Guam.

## BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN

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- 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Richard W. Fee was born in Philadelphia,
- 4 Pennsylvania, and lived there until the age of six (6), when he moved to
- 5 Runameade, New Jersey; and
- 6 **WHEREAS,** as an adolescent, Dr. Fee was a less than exemplary
- 7 student, getting by with mere Bs and Cs, but decidedly made the
- 8 conscientious decision as a senior in high school to buckle down and
- 9 become an A student, resulting in his graduation from Triton High School;
- 10 and
- 11 WHEREAS, these concerted efforts to do well in school paid off, as
- 12 Dr. Fee was accepted into, attended, and graduated from the University of
- Oklahoma where he obtained his Bachelor of Arts in History in 1968; and
- 14 WHEREAS, following graduation from college, Dr. Fee initially
- 15 began his career as a history teacher, when he accidentally stumbled into
- 16 the Sunshine Cottage School for the Deaf in San Antonio, Texas, a private
- school for the Deaf, where he discovered his calling to return to school and
- 18 receive his certification to be a teacher for the Deaf; and
- 19 WHEREAS, upon getting his certification, Dr. Fee taught at the same
- school that had inspired him, the Sunshine Cottage School for the Deaf;
- 21 and

1 WHEREAS, his passion led him to travel to Hong Kong where he privately tutored a deaf student for a period of two (2) years; traveled to 2 Montana State School to teach the Deaf and Blind; traveled to the beautiful 3 island of Guam to teach the Deaf, at what is now known as, Jose Rios 4 5 Middle School; and WHEREAS, his passion for teaching further led Dr. Fee to Canberra, 6 7 Australia, to work for the Ministry of Education as the Chief Researcher for Special Education, while simultaneously working on his Masters of 8 9 Education; and WHEREAS, Dr. Fee endeavored to advance his education by 10 attending the California State University in Northridge, California, where 11 12 he was conferred a Master of Arts degree in Educational Administration in 13 1980; and 14 WHEREAS, Dr. Fee officially earned the title of Education Specialist (Ed.S.) from the University of Idaho in 1998, and subsequently earned his 15 Ph.D. in Philosophy (Education) shortly thereafter in 1999 from the same 16 17 school, thereby becoming a double doctorate; and 18 WHEREAS, since that time, Dr. Fee has devoted his life to teaching and training education professionals in the field of Special Education, with 19 a special interest in serving the deaf community, and has served in many 20

capacities, including as a Principal, a Chief Executive Officer, a Director, a

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- 1 Superintendent, an Adjunct Professor, an Educational Consultant, and
- 2 now an Associate Professor; and
- 3 WHEREAS, Dr. Fee has worked as an Associate Professor at the
- 4 University of Guam since 2006, and as of Fall Semester 2010, Dr. Fee
- 5 hooded his 90th graduate student; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Dr. Richard Fee is a highly sought-after speaker on
- 7 Special Education, Deaf Education, and Cochlear Implants, and has done
- 8 extensive traveling throughout the United States, Australia, South Africa,
- 9 and to the Philippines, where he is applying for the Fulbright Scholarship
- 10 to fund the very worthy project of providing training workshops to
- 11 teachers for the Deaf and audiologists; now be it
- RESOLVED, that the I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does
- 13 hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, highly commend Dr. Richard W.
- 14 Fee for his dedicated service in the area of Special Education in Guam; and
- 15 be it further
