4	WHEREAS, Mrs. Rios was affectionately known to the people of Guam as "Auntie Candy"
5	or "Auntie Lala"; and
6	WHEREAS, Auntie Lala was married to Joseph Leon Guerrero Rios (deceased); and
7	WHEREAS, she was a dedicated mother to Joleen (deceased), Joseph Jr, Rose, John and
8	Helen; and
9	WHEREAS, she graduated from George Washington High School and received her
10	Associates Degree in Elementary Education from the College of Guam and her Masters in Education
11	Degree in Elementary Administration and Supervision from the University of Guam; and
12	WHEREAS, she was a long time educator and worked as a elementary school teacher and
13	Assistant Principal in New Piti Elementary School and Principal at C.L. Taitano Elementary School
14	and was dedicated to improving education on Guam and the quality of life for each of the children in
15	her schools; and
16	WHEREAS, she was the Project Director for the Hawaii English Program and Manager of a
17	day care center; and
18	WHEREAS, she held positions in the Government of Guam including Passport Officer and
19	Deputy Director for the GovGuam Retirement Fund; and
20	WHEREAS, she was active in the community and was chairperson and member of
21	numerous non-profit organizations such as the Pope John's Representative Stage & Grounds
22	Committee, Queen's Committee Fiestan Guam (Liberation Celebrations, Latte of Freedom), Guma

1 Mami Board and raising for the Mentally Retarded Adults, Chief Quipua & Sirena Statute Projects, 2 Stage Committee for President Reagan's visit, Vocational Education Advisors Council, Retired 3 Educators Association, Guam Elementary Administrators Association, Chamorro Organization, 4 Inetnon Famalaoan Club and Retirement Employee's Association; and

5 WHEREAS, she was a distinguished leader in the Democrat party was a founding member 6 of the Women's Democrat Party of Guam; and

7 WHEREAS, she was responsible along with her brother, Richard Taitano(deceased) for the 8 implementation of the village organizations at the grass roots level to expand the Democrat Party 9 values and beliefs; and
