WHEREAS, Greg was brought up with a strong background of his cultural heritage. Greg was a Chamorro in every sense of the word. How he approached and defined *friendship*. How he resolved situations and how he raised his *family*. How he built his house with an extended kitchen that allowed his families and friends to gather and celebrate *i espiritun dinana*. Greg was always mindful that there is a tomorrow. If there is not enough, it's okay, Tomorrow will bring a better day, *na utas i guinaha'ta*.
