WHEREAS, the decline in economic conditions throughout Asia and the world has directly impacted Guam's primary economic engine – tourism-- over the past several months, resulting in the loss of jobs and the reduction in work hours within business entities directly associated with Guam's visitor industry; and

WHEREAS, because of Guam's declining tourism numbers and the affect on the people of Guam, it is critical that Guam be included in the consideration of the anticipated economic stimulus proposal that would provide direct investment of federal funds and resources into improving dilapidated infrastructure, i.e. roads, water, power, wastewater, public structures, etc., and address other community facility requirements; and
