WHEREAS, Tun Juan Lujan Pangelinan, familian (Kotla), the former Commissioner (Mayor) of Agaña Heights, was called by our Heavenly Father to his eternal rest on January 23, 2009, at the age of 86, having lived a long and noteworthy life; and

WHEREAS, Tun Juan was one of eight children born to †Francisco Borja Pangelinan and †Natividad Pangelinan Lujan, on May 18, 1922; and

WHEREAS, on July 5, 1944, during the Japanese occupation of Guam, and just 16 days before the Liberation of our island by American forces, Tun Juan and †Dolores (Lole) Haniu Untalan were married, in total conflict with the demands of a Japanese General and at the risk of being beheaded or killed; and

WHEREAS, following the end of World War II, Tun Juan worked as a machinist for a U.S. Military officer and was also a part time taxi driver; and

WHEREAS, Tun Juan also had a home delivery service, bringing water, meat and Coca-Cola to people, earning him the nicknames "Juan Hanom, Juan Katne and Juan Coke, and

WHEREAS, in 1952, Tun Juan had the distinction of being elected as the first and only successful "write-in" candidate for village Commissioner, and he served his village of Agaña Heights as its Commissioner for 16 years, from 1952 to 1968; and

WHEREAS, Commissioner Pangelinan had the distinction of founding the Agaña Heights Drum & Bugle Corps, Majorettes and Armed Drill Team, and Agaña Heights was the first village to construct school bus shelters for students; and

WHEREAS, following the devastation of Super Typhoon Karen in 1962, Commissioner Pangelinan Coordinated an Agaña Heights "tent city" for village families to take shelter, and he was also a member of Helping Hands of Guam, which predated the Section Eight and Food Stamp programs, to assist the most needy in our community; and

WHEREAS, in 1962, Tun Juan co-founded a family neighborhood store, Lole's Retail Store, also known as *Kotla's* Store, and later developed the "Villa *Kotla"* subdivision in *Paasan*, Agaña Heights, and in 1976 co-founded *Kotla's* Wash & Dri, a family-run laundromat; and

WHEREAS, Tun Juan was a very community-oriented individual, having memberships in the Young Men's League of Guam (YMLG), Agana Heights Holy Name Society, Agana Heights Association, Agana Heights May Fair Fundraising Committee, and he was well-known in the community as the provider of free funeral "hearse" service with his private station wagon; and

WHEREAS, after 16 years as Commissioner, Tun Juan Lujan Pangelinan began a new career as a staff member in the Guam Legislature, where he served the people of Guam for another eight years, retiring from the Government of Guam in 1976 after 30 years of service to his community and island; and

WHEREAS, Tun Juan had a passion for studying and chronicling his family genealogy, and published the hardbound family genealogy books "Familian Kotla" and "Familian Haniu," and had two other books in progress: "Familian Lujan" and "Familian Untalan; and

WHEREAS, Tun Juan is survived by his children Frank & (Pep & Angie), Toni & Dave Sanford, Tita & Frank Castro, Loling & Harold Field, John & June, Gerianne Pangelinan, and Joe & Marie; and

WHEREAS, Tun Juan's 20 grandchildren and 16 great grandchildren are: Viola & Tony, †Frank J., John Thomas, Nicolas, Tony & Chris, Jerry & Angy, David, Lollie & Dennis, Mike, Karen & Rick, Kelly, John Vince, Jason & Eugenia, Nessa & Craig, Giana-Nicole, Gerard & Audria, Jonathon, Amannie, Gennell, Joeann; and Anthony, Andrew, Anesha, Anson, Reese, Austin, Meilani, *Aunikah, Kristene, Erika, Sawyer, Bill, Ralph, Lauryn, Javen, Crysandra, Jordan, and Trinity; and

WHEREAS, Tun Juan's siblings are: †William (Dory) & †Dorothy & †Sedra, †Salvador (Do') & †Josefa, Serafina (Ninang) & †Jesus Fejeran, †Maria (Tita) and †Jose Cruz; †Francisca, Sister Mary Alma, RSM, Luisa (Ling) & Antonio Manalisay; now therefore be it
