Relative to remembering and memorializing the Late Joseph Charles Murphy on his legacy as Guam's foremost journalist and columnist, and thanking him for his service to our island and offering condolences to his family.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTA NUEBI NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, the People of Guam lost an icon of journalism on February 5, 2009, when the great columnist, writer, and editor Joseph Charles Murphy passed on; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Charles Murphy better known as "Joe" to his family, friends, and readers, was born on February 23, 1927 in Appleton, Wisconsin; and

WHEREAS, Joe Murphy married his high school sweetheart, Marion, 62 wonderful years ago and have 7 children: Colleen, Maureen, Shannon, Timothy, Erin, Megan, and Joey; 25 grandchildren, and 17 great grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Joe Murphy joined the Navy at the age of 17 during World War II, returned home after WWII to finish high school, eloped with Marion on the night of their high school graduation, and later went on to earn a degree in journalism from the University of Wisconsin at Madison, and worked as a journalist ever since; and

WHEREAS, Joe Murphy worked as a reporter, editor and columnist in Wisconsin Oregon, and California before taking a job in Guam in 1965; and

WHEREAS, Joe Murphy arrived on Guam on December 8, 1965, Our Lady of Kamalen Day, and joked that the procession was a welcoming parade just for him, as he knew Guam would be his home for the rest of his life; and

WHEREAS, Joe Murphy took a job running what was then known as the Guam Daily News, and is now known as the Pacific Daily News, becoming the editor and writer of the column for which he is most well known, "Pipe Dreams," and other daily editorial topics such as new developments, the economy, innovative ideas, and politics, and later traveled around the Pacific to produce more editorials about our region as the issues relate to Guam; and

WHEREAS, Joe Murphy loved adventure and took advantage of offers to try many different things and write about them, and is the author of two books: "Guam is a Four Letter Word" and "Son of a Four Letter Word;" and

WHEREAS, Joe Murphy later retired as editor of Pacific Daily News in 1988, but continued to write his column which changed names from "Pipe Dreams" to "Murphy's Law" after he quit smoking; and

WHEREAS, upon retirement and raising his children to adulthood, Joe Murphy took his great love, Marion, and traveled the world because of his love for history, geography, culture and politics and was always looking for new ideas that might work on Guam, his beloved home, and he shared those thoughts in his column in the Pacific Daily News; and

WHEREAS, Joseph Murphy's legacy lives on in the island of Guam and with it's people, but most especially his children who have carried on his passion for writing and journalism and have followed in his footsteps and made it their business like their father; and

WHEREAS, in February 2007, Joe Murphy wrote a column about his 80th birthday where he reflected on his passionate life, wild youth and changing island; and

WHEREAS, Joe Murphy always believed in equality, pushing his daughters as well as his sons to find their passions and excel in life; he thought highly of island people and together with his wife passed their attitudes about islanders to all those who encountered their presence; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam will sorely miss the writings, the thoughts, and the humor that we grew up with and that enriched our lives for nearly four decades as we all mourn the passing of Joseph Charles Murphy, journalist extraordinaire; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the committee on rules of *I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam grieve over the loss of the Late Joseph Charles Murphy and offer it's condolences and sympathies to his wife and children; and, be it further
