3 WHEREAS, the Training Program for Federal TRIO Programs (TRIO

4 Training Programs) was authorized by the 1976 education amendments of the

5 Higher Education Act, as amended, to focus specifically on improving the

6 design and administration of TRIO services; and is one of eight TRIO

7 Programs, exhibiting the commitment of the United States of America to

8 providing educational opportunity to all eligible students regardless of race,

9 ethnicity, or other similar disadvantaged backgrounds; and

WHEREAS, the TRIO Training Programs provide funding to enhance the skills and expertise of project directors and staff in the different Federal TRIO Programs, to include annual training on student financial aid, general project management for new directors, legislative and regulatory requirements, the design and operation of model programs, and the use of educational technology, so that the project directors and staff can better serve and address the needs of participants in their particular geographical region and communities; and

WHEREAS, the University of Washington (UW) TRIO Training Programs, since it was first awarded funding in 1989 under the leadership of Dr. Karen Morrell, continues to provide training and staff development to TRIO Programs throughout the United States, its territories and other insular areas; and

WHEREAS, the UW TRIO Training Programs actively embraces new technologies to enhance its activities as shown through its online TRIO Virtual Center, which provides resources, tutorials, and training modules, and its interactive eTRIO Resources website, a gateway for access to current and future online resources, including free tools to help programs with its data collection and management; both of which are accessible to all TRIO staff and students across geographical and political boundaries; and

WHEREAS, the UW TRIO Training Programs' commitment to taking full advantage of the opportunities of today's technology is most prominent in its TRIO Quest Activities, an annual competition where TRIO students can submit entries in the photo essay, audio and video design, or web design

categories; and
