Relative to Expressing the Support of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* for a one hundred eighty (180) day extension of the implementation date for the Guam-CNMI Visa Waiver Program.

BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA' TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN

GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, P.L. 110-229, the Consolidated Natural Resources Act (CNRA)

of 2008, authorized the promulgation of rules for the revised Guam-CNMI Visa

5 Waiver Program; and

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6 WHEREAS, on January 13, 2009 the Department of Homeland Security

published the interim rules establishing the list of approved countries for the Guam-

CNMI Visa Waiver Program but deleted Russia and the People's Republic of China as

countries that posed national security concerns; and

WHEREAS, the CNMI had realized significant economic benefit from the

expenditure by visitors from both Russia and the People's Republic of China under

the CNMI Visa Entry Program, but the deletion of these countries from the list would

cause irreparable harm to the CNMI visitor industry and to its overall economy; and

WHEREAS, section 702(b) of the CNRA allows the Department of Homeland

Security to delay the implementation date for one hundred eighty (180) days upon

request from either the CNMI and/or Guam governor; and

WHEREAS, during the State of the Island Address delivered by Guam Governor Felix P. Camacho on February 16, 2009, a call was made by the Governor to support such a delay of the implementation date; and

WHEREAS, it is the intent of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* to also support such a delay and to ultimately seek the inclusion of Russia and the People's Republic of China on the list of approved countries for the Guam-CNMI Visa Waiver Program; now, therefore, be it

**RESOLVED,** that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, request that the Department of Homeland Security approve a one hundred eighty (180) day extension of the June 1, 2009 implementation date for the revised Guam-CNMI Visa Waiver Program; and, be it further

**RESOLVED,** that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, respectfully call upon the Department of Homeland Security to re-assess its current position on the exclusion of Russia and the People's Republic of China from the list of approved countries for the Guam-CNMI Visa Waiver Program; and, be it further

**RESOLVED,** that *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, seek the assistance of Guam Delegate Madeleine Z. Bordallo to ensure that the congressional intent embodied in P.L. 110-229 has been fully implemented with the publishing of the interim rules, and if the rules are contrary to such intent, to bring this matter to the immediate attention of the Honorable Janet Napolitano, Secretary, Department of Homeland Security for corrective action; and be it further

**RESOLVED,** that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to: the Honorable Janet Napolitano, Secretary, Department of Homeland Security; to the Honorable Madeleine Z.
