WHEREAS, AmeriCorps Week 2009 is the time to salute AmeriCorps 3 members, Guam AmeriCorps Alumni Chapter, Guam Volunteer Center in 4 partnership with the University of Guam, Military, Island community and the 5 Governor's Serve Guam! Commission for the powerful impact their 6 demonstrated action to community and public service by 7 dedication individuals has on building a better more livable community; and

WHEREAS, Americorps Week 2009 is the time to thank the many community partners in recruiting, recognizing, encouraging and motivating volunteer's to continue to promote the ethic of service and volunteering since its creation in 1994 in our island community with "We're Counting On You!" to serve; and
