RELATIVE TO ENDORSEMENT BY THIS BODY OF **PROVISIONS** PERTAINING TO CERTAIN THE OF GUAM, TERRITORY THE PENDING MILITARY BUILDUP UPON GUAM. AND LABOR UPON GUAM CONTAINED WITHIN THE ACT CURRENTLY KNOWN AS H.R. 2647 OR THE NATIONAL DEFENSE AUTHORIZATION ACT FOR FISCAL YEAR 2010 AND REQUESTING THAT 111TH SAID PROVISIONS BE **ENACTED** BY THE CONGRESS AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE UNITED STATES AS CURRENTLY WRITTEN FOR THE BENEFIT **OF THE PEOPLE OF GUAM.**

2 Whereas, Guam's workers are currently being treated like second class 3 citizens by being paid less than half of what their brothers and sisters in

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Hawaii are paid for doing the same work for the same company on a Federal
 Contract,

Whereas, Guam's cost of living is considered the same as Hawaii's by the
Federal Government,

Whereas, Low wages on Federal contracts rob Guam's families of a decent
standard of living and Guam's economy of hundreds of Millions of Federal
dollars a year,

8 Whereas, The majority of Guam's families are desperate for good middle9 class jobs,

Whereas, Thousands of Guam's families that have moved to the mainland
 United States in search of a decent standard of living would love to come
 home if there were decent middle class jobs available on Guam,

Whereas, The upcoming military buildup should benefit all of Guam's
families and not just an elite few,

Whereas, numerous incidents of scandals involving the abuse of Temporary Foreign Workers upon Guam have demonstrated that H2-B Visa programs within the territory of Guam have been severely misused in a manner that is inhumane, incompatible with our morals and values, and at times an appalling violation of the human rights of workers according to the standards of the United States Government, the Laws of the Territory of Guam, and the United Nations. Whereas, American Tax dollars spent on American Military facilities should
 go to Americans Workers and build American economies first and foremost,

Whereas, the People of Guam have paid a high price for their citizenship by being the only Americans to ever endure occupation by a foreign power, by serving in the Armed forces at an unprecedented rate, and still suffering to this day from the effects of being downwind from the U.S Military Nuclear tests on Bikini Atoll, and thus, at the very least, deserve the same benefits and wages as every other American,

9 Whereas, this body recognizes that an estimated 10 billion additional Federal 10 dollars flowing into the pockets of local construction workers would result in 11 enormous benefit not only to said worker's family but to our entire economy 12 as they buy new cars, go out to eat, rent houses and apartments and spend 13 money in our local stores,

Whereas, economists estimate that every additional dollar paid to local
workers circulate in our economy up to ten times,

Whereas, the hundreds of Millions of dollars in tax revenue generated by
increased wages will provide much needed additional funding for Guam's
Public Health, Safety and Education,

Whereas, *I Liheslatura* recognizes that the people of Guam would overwhelmingly benefit from the amendments made by Congressman Neil Abercrombie (D) of Hawaii to the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2010, currently H.R. 2647, which will increase Guam's

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prevailing wage and provide a fair chance for all of Guam's people to benefit
from the pending Guam military buildup; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, that I Mina'Trenta Na Liheslaturan Guåhan, on behalf of the 3 People of Guam, hereby formally request that the One-Hundred Eleventh 4 United States Senate, and President Barack Obama, in finalizing the act 5 currently known as H.R. 2647, the National Defense Authorization Act for 6 Fiscal Year 2010, pass into law the amendments introduced by Congressman 7 Neil Abercrombie of Hawaii, specifically sections 2833 and 2834 of Subtitle 8 (C), "Provisions Related To Guam Realignment", TITLE XXVIII of this Act 9 as currently written in the version of this legislation passed by the United 10 States House of Representatives on June 25th, 2009, these provisions being 11 hereby recognized by this body as critical to the wellbeing of Guam's people 12 during the military buildup and critical to the future of Guam's society and 13 14 economy.

Resolved, that the Speaker and Chairman Speaker and the Chairman of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to the adoption hereof and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to President Barack Obama; to each and every member of the 111th United States Senate; and to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, *I Maga'lahen Guåhan*.
