WHEREAS, in 2009, rather than Dr. Whitfield taking the day off to celebrate New Year's, she was at the hospital where she received Anabelle's newborn sister to ensure that she too was in good health. Even after this, Dr. Whitfield continued to

avail herself to ElizaEmma (newborn) and Anabelle who "stole the Doc's heart" without ever expressing being tired frustrated or even that she'd rather be somewhere else; and

WHEREAS, for many children like Anabelle and their families who receive care from Dr. Whitfield, they will all be remorseful that her time to leave Guam has come. Anabelle and her family have all been touched by an *Angel* in Dr. Yolanda Whitfield via the United States Navy and now she must fly to aid other children and families with the same genuine care and love that she had bestowed upon us; and
