WHEREAS, the military buildup set to begin in Guam next year

4 brings to light the lack of a strategic plan to ensure children in

today's classrooms are prepared to seize the opportunities of our

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WHEREAS, while there are concerns about preparedness for the

8 military buildup and Guam's capacity, the government must realize

9 that the key to economic prosperity does not rest solely on the

military buildup, and cannot happen without forward thinking and

11 action to develop a new Guam economy in light of the

unprecedented opportunities of a \$15 billion investment; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam, their hopes, aspirations, and potential, are so much bigger than the military buildup, which will end in 2014; and

WHEREAS, if the government of Guam does nothing to promote the economic interests and prosperity of our people, who will lead our own industries, then it either surrenders the opportunities of tomorrow to outside and foreign interests, or it dooms our people to a major recession once the military finishes its buildup; and

WHEREAS, the people of Guam have an opportunity to foster a new Guam economy, led by the bright minds and ambitions of the schoolchildren of Guam, who will be graduating into the real world of work; and

WHEREAS, the Legislature recognizes that local talent, guided by an education system working in tandem with the economic needs this community believes and projects Guam can have, can drive the development of new industry and the expansion of existing ones; and WHEREAS, Guam can determine the future of the economy through proper planning and the prioritization of future resources to the education of tomorrow's workforce – children in today's classrooms; and

WHEREAS, this Legislature, like no other in history, has the responsibility to create and adopt a long-term vision and policy to foster a new Guam economy by steering the island's 32,000 schoolchildren into the careers of the future; and

WHEREAS, several Guam agencies have made notable efforts to build a workforce, but there is no government-wide policy or support system to bring these efforts together in a strategic plan for economic prosperity; and WHEREAS, the Legislature must take the lead, because it has a responsibility to appropriate the resources education agencies and the labor agencies need. It also must plan properly the investment of future revenues, which will grow over the next five years. There is no more important investment than the future of Guam's children; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that *I Liheslatura* hereby establishes its role to foster the creation and adoption of a strategic plan, put together by community stakeholders, to map out a new Guam economy and to ensure children in classrooms today are educated to lead the careers of tomorrow in this new economy; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Legislature hereby creates the Classrooms-to-Careers Working Group, hereinafter "Working Group," with the following mandates:

(a) Creation, Composition, Quorum, and Voting. The Working Group shall consist of ten members, at the most, including one senator appointed by the Speaker of the Legislature; and one senator appointed by the Minority Leader of the Legislature. The working group shall invite to its membership the Guam Education Policy Board Chairman or his designee, the Chamber of Commerce Chairman or his designee, the Guam Contractors Licensing Board Chairman or his designee, the Superintendent of Education or her designee, the University of Guam President or his designee, the Guam Community College President or her designee, the Guam Department of Labor director or her and the Guam Economic Development designee; Commerce Authority Administrator or his designee. The members of the Working Group will choose among themselves

a Chairman, who shall call for and conduct meetings of the Working Group, during its first meeting, which shall be no later than February 1, 2010. No business may be conducted without the presence of a quorum of at least six members and without strict compliance to the Open Government Act. No decisions shall be made without the affirmative vote of a majority of the quorum present and voting.

- (b) Identifying Potential for New Industries, Projecting New Guam Economy, Identifying Careers. The Working Group shall identify and bring together Guam's industry leaders into a Workforce and Careers Convention by February 28, 2010. The members of the convention, through consensus and with the technical support and expertise of the University of Guam, will project the growth of existing industries, determine new industries that can be created, and identify the types and number of careers that will drive these industries. The convention then shall finalize its findings by March 31, 2010 and turn such findings over to the Working Group.
- (c) Education Planning. The Working Group shall identify educators, student leaders, parent leaders, education planners, curriculum experts, and other professionals and convene an Educators Convention immediately following the release of findings from the Workforce and Careers Convention. The members of the convention, through consensus, will determine what the Guam Department of Education, the Guam Community College and the University of Guam, together, must do to educate Guam's students into the careers identified by the Workforce and Careers Convention. These discussions

shall include plans for the strengthening of an early childhood education system of care. The members of the convention shall consider the discussions and findings of the Guam Education Summit. The Educators Convention must finalize and submit its findings to the Working Group by April 30, 2010.

- (d) Adoption of Findings by Governing Boards. The Working Group shall transmit the findings of the Educators Convention to the Joint Educational Board, as established by Chapter 16A, Title 17, Guam Code Annotated, immediately following the submission of findings by the Educators Convention. The Working Group will call for the Joint Educational Board to convene, review the findings of the Educators Convention, and make the recommendation for the governing boards of DOE, GCC and UOG to consider the adoption of such findings as education policy. The Working Group will ask the Joint Educational Board to concur with the findings, to transmit the findings to each governing board, and to call for the convening of each board by May 31, 2010.
 - (e) Submission of Strategic Plan to Legislature; Adoption. If each governing board meets and adopts these policies by June 30, 2010, the Working Group will finalize the Classroom-to-Careers strategic plan based on the findings of both conventions, and present the plan to the full Legislature for that body's consideration and adoption; and be it further
- **RESOLVED,** that the Department of Education, the Guam Community College and the University of Guam will submit a revised Fiscal Year 2011 budget, with spending forecasts based on the adopted strategic plan through Fiscal Year 2013; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Legislative 1 Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same 2 be hereafter transmitted to the Chairman of the Guam Education 3 Policy Board; the Chairman of the Guam Chamber of Commerce; the 4 Chairman of the Guam Contractors Licensing 5 Board; Superintendent of Education; the President of the University of 6 Guam; the President of the Guam Community College; the Director 7 of the Guam Department of Labor; the Administrator of the Guam 8 9 Economic Development and Commerce Authority; and Honorable Felix P. Camacho, I Maga' Lahen Guåhan. 10
