3 WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez, originally from Mongmong, Guam, a graduate of Father Duenas

Memorial High School, and a resident of California since 1995, is an accomplished poet; and

5 WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez has a Bachelor of Arts from the University of Redlands, a Masters of

6 Fine Arts in Writing from the University of San Francisco, and has participated in studies abroad in Florence,

7 Italy and Moscow, Russia; and

WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez is a Ph.D. candidate in Comparative Ethnic Studies as well as a

research fellow at the University of California at Berkeley; and

10 WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez is the author of two poetry books about Guam, from Unincorporated

Territory [hacha], (Tinfish Press, 2008), and from Unincorporated Territory [saina], (Omnidawn Publishing,

12 2010) in addition to authoring of several chapbooks, including constellations gathered around the ecliptic

(Shadowbox Press, 2007), all with ocean views (Overhere Press, 2007), and preterrain (Corollary Press, 2008); and

WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez is a co-founder of Achiote Press, and has had his poetry, essays and reviews published in various media including the Colorado Review, the Denver Quarterly, the Iowa Review, New American Writing, Pleiades, and ZYZZYVA, among others; and

WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez, whose poetic use of personal and familial narratives to continue the themes of culture, language, memory, family and history, is being sponsored and honored by the Guam Humanities Council, as part of their project, "8,000 How Will It Change Our Lives?" Community Conversations on the Military Buildup in Guam, in an effort to encourage island residents to examine the impact of the relocation of military personnel and their families to Guam in 2014, through humanities-based conversations on related themes of service, leadership, community, identity and power; and

WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez will be honoring our island residents with a weeklong series of readings and discussions with high school and college students, presentations with the larger public including *An Evening with the Author* poetry reading and fundraiser on Thursday, March 25 at Meskla Restaurant and a larger community conversation event will take place on Wednesday, March 24 at the Outrigger Guam Resort, sponsored and coordinated by the Guam Humanities Council; and

WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez's poetry, from his collection in *from unincorporated territory* [hacha] (2008), was selected for recognition from among 712 competing entries; and

WHEREAS, Craig Santos Perez is the recipient of this year's California Writers Exchange Award, funded by the James Irvine Foundation, for which he was awarded an all-expense paid trip to New York City to give a public reading and to meet with top literary professionals, including editors, agents, publishers, and prominent writers; and

WHEREAS, I Mina' Trenta Na Lihelsaturan Guahan would like to acknowledge the strategic use of typography, diagrams, maps, illustrations, and other aspects of visual design to expound on the politics and

poetics of the writings of Craig Santos Perez, which will initiate an increased awareness of Guam and raise the consciousness, with regard to our island culture; now, therefore be it

**RESOLVED**, that the Committee of Rules of *I Mina' Trenta Na Lihelslaturan Guåhan*, does hereby honor and commend Craig Santos Perez for his meritorious ability to eloquently convey his thoughts, feelings and spirit through his writings, thereby bringing national recognition to both his work and his island home; and be it further
