- 3 WHEREAS, autism is a complex developmental disability that typically
- 4 appears during the first three years of life and affects a person's ability to
- 5 communicate and interact with others; and
- 7 WHEREAS, autism is defined by a certain set of behaviors and is a
- 8 "spectrum disorder" that affects individuals differently and to varying
- 9 degrees; and

WHEREAS, autism is four times more prevalent in boys than girls and knows no racial, ethnic, or social boundaries; and

WHEREAS, there is no known single cause for autism, but increased awareness and funding can help families today; and

WHEREAS, in December 2009, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention issued their autism prevalence report and concluded that the prevalence of autism had risen to 1 in every 110 births in the United States and almost 1 in 70 boys; and

WHEREAS, 13 million American families are now living with the effects of autism spectrum disorder and Autism Society currently estimates that the lifetime cost of caring for a child with autism ranges from \$3.5 million to \$5 million and that the United States is facing almost \$90 billion annually in costs for autism; and

WHEREAS, accurate, early diagnosis before three years of age, appropriate education and intervention are vital to the future growth and development of individuals with autism; and

WHEREAS, through the increased awareness and services available to individuals with autism, the lives of our friends with autism can be made easier, while those without autism can expand their understanding of the needs and challenges that individuals with autism are experiencing; and

WHEREAS, parents, support groups, researchers, and professionals have dedicated years of service in their ongoing efforts to advocate for the rights, humane treatment, and appropriate education of all persons with autism; and

WHEREAS, in order to highlight the growing need for concern and awareness about autism, the Autism Society has been celebrating National Autism Awareness Month since 1970s. The United States recognizes April

as a special opportunity for everyone to educate the public about autism 1 and issues within the autism community; and 2
