I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN 2010 (SECOND) Regular Session

Relative to recognizing and expressing a most sincere *Un Dangkulo na Si Yu'os Ma'ase'* to Reverend E. Neil Culbertson for his contributions to our island community; and extending him best wishes on behalf of the people of Guam on his relocation.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Reverend E. Neil Culbertson was born on May 11, 1954 in Klamath Falls, Oregon, where he spent his childhood years; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Culbertson enlisted in the United States Army, serving as a Chaplain's Assistant, and earned his High School Equivalency Degree though the U.S. Armed Forces in 1972; and

WHEREAS, upon completion of his military service, Reverend Culbertson earned his Bachelor of Arts degree in Classical Studies: Ancient & Medieval History, Philosophy, and Languages from Dordt College in Sioux Center, Iowa in 1979, and in 1983 earned a Masters of Divinity from Calvin Theological Seminary in Grand Rapids, Michigan, and was ordained a Minister of the Word and Sacrament; and

WHEREAS, during his college years, Reverend Culbertson maintained high academic standings, becoming a published writer and leading two conference workshops examining Dating & Relationships from a Christian perspective; and

WHEREAS, from 1983 to 1990 Reverend Culbertson served as a missionary-pastor for Christian Reformed World Missions, with an assignment to the Faith Presbyterian Reformed Church of Guam, which at

that time had been a missionary dependent organization for some 30+ years; and

WHEREAS, beginning in 1990 the congregation fully supported its pastor and all ministry operations and Reverend Culbertson became its first "called" pastor, the Church holding its first official service in its new ministry facilities, an over \$1.4 Million project, on May 12, 2004; and

WHEREAS, in 2006, the Little Lambs Pre-school & Daycare was established as an extension of the congregational ministries of the Church; and

WHEREAS, the Faith Presbyterian Reformed Church of Guam was received into full membership of the Christian Reformed Church of America (CRCNA) through Classis Greater Los Angeles, a regional grouping of Christian Reformed churches of the greater Los Angeles area, Hawaii and Guam; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure at the Church, Pastor Culbertson also gave of his time to other organizations, including serving from the early 1980's to 2008 as a Board Member and in other capacities for the Pacific Islands Bible College, with a goal of establishing higher theological and biblical training of island pastors and future Christian workers, achieving full DOE accreditation, and founding a Guam campus with enrollment of more than 75 students, alongside a similar number of students attending the Chuuk campus; and

WHEREAS, During the mid-1980's he served as a Board Member and, briefly, as President of the Bible Society of Micronesia, under the umbrella of the United Bibles Societies, to promote biblical literacy among Guam's children in all elementary and private schools; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Culbertson continues as a volunteer with the Prison Fellowship Guam Chapter, speaking at services organized by prison chaplains associated with the Prison Ministry, and WHEREAS, Reverend Culbertson has been a member of the Guam
Ministerial Association since 1983, serving variously as President, Vice
President or Secretary/Treasurer until 2008, and also served as
Administrator for the Guam Ministerial Health Plan, providing grou
medical and dental insurance for various pastors, interdenominational
missions and other church workers who do not have access to wellestablished denominational plans; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Culbertson served with other community leaders, at the invitation of then-Governor Carl Gutierrez, on the Guam Vision 2000 Committee, to create the overall agenda for the Governor's vision of a comprehensive plan for improving services and the quality of life in Guam; and

WHEREAS, under the auspices of the Guam Ministerial Association, Reverend Culbertson employed a volunteer panel of local mental health professionals, counselors, and clergy for the Island-Leaders Conference on the Blight of Pornography, making a presentation to a majority of the Guam Legislature and then-Governor Joseph Ada and First Lady Roseanne Ada, receiving a Legislative Resolution commending the GMA for its contribution to the social and spiritual health of Guam; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Culbertson assisted frequently with the Guam celebrations of The National Day of Prayer, held frequently at Government House in Agana Heights and in coordination with the National Day of Prayer association, and in 1989 gave the keynote address to assembled clergy, government officials and friends; and

WHEREAS, the good Reverend served as President of the Guam Running Club from 2002 – 2004, his interest in running turning into an invitation to lead the club's 250 members, and during his tenure developed the club's website, winning a best website award from Run The Planet in

November 2002, and receiving over 50,000 worldwide visits in its first five 1 years of operation; and 2

WHEREAS, as GRC president he became Director of The Guam Marathon for 2002 through 2004, designing the new Guam Marathon course when the original course had become too dangerous; and

WHEREAS, Reverend Culbertson has also been a member of the Andersen Air Force Base 3rd Division Civilian Advisory Committee; was an emcee for the Community Forum Series on Decision Making at Life's End in 2006; served as a member on then-Lieutenant Governor Madeleine Bordallo's Committee on Protocol, resulting in formalizing the inclusion of Protestant clergy with Catholic clergy in all official judicial, legislative and executive branch addresses; and was a 2006 Member of the Governor's Military/Civilian Task Force on Education Realignment, helping to shape the future direction of cooperation between military, public and private schools; now thererefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules, on behalf of *I Mina' Trenta* na Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people of Guam, does hereby recognize and commend Reverend E. Neil Culbertson for his numerous contributions to our island community and his life's work in strengthening the faith of our people and bringing the teachings of the Bible to the people of Guam, and to extend to him our most heartfelt *Un Dangkulo na Si Yu'os Ma'åse* and best wishes on behalf of the people of Guam on his relocation; and be it further

RESOLVED, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on Rules certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to the Reverend E. Neil Culbertson and his wife of 30 years, Janie-Lou Kannegieter Culbertson; and to the Faith Presbyterian Reformed Church of Guam; and

to the Honorable Felix P. Camacho, I Maga'Lahen Guåhan.
