RELATIVE TO COMMENDING AND CONGRATULATING MS. YURI KIM FOR HER OUTSTANDING COMMITMENT TO SERVICE OF THE PEOPLE OF GUAM; FOR BEING THE ONLY FOREIGN SERVICE OFFICER COMMISSIONED FROM GUAM; AND TO EXTENDING OUR BEST WISHES AS SHE CONTINUES HER WORK IN DIPLOMATIC POLICY.

WHEREAS, in 1974 at the age of three (3), Ms. Yuri Kim with her parents, Mr. Kenneth Tae Rang Kim and her late mother Mrs. Jane Wha-Young Kim, immigrated from Korea to Guam; and

6 WHEREAS, in 1989 she graduated high school at the Academy of Our 7 Lady of Guam and in 1993 went on to receive her bachelor's degree in 8 Political Science at the University of Pennsylvania. Ms. Kim continued her 9 educational career and went on to attend Cambridge University where she 10 received her master's in political and social theory. Immediately after, Ms. 11 Kim began working with government and non-government organizations advocating for the protection of consumer rights in Congressional legislation
 related to trade as a consumer rights lobbyist in Washington D.C.; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Kim was Political Counselor at the U.S. Embassy in Baghdad from 2009 to 2010, in which capacity she played a leading role in negotiations on the law that governed Iraq's first national election since achieving full sovereignty in 2009, directed U.S. support for the March 2010 national elections in Iraq, and helped plan and execute the historic transition of the U.S. presence in Iraq from one led by the military to one led by civilians, including the responsible drawdown of U.S. forces in Iraq; and

WHEREAS, prior to most recent role, Ms. Kim was Special Assistant to
Ambassador Christopher R. Hill, Assistant Secretary of State for East Asia and
Pacific Affairs. From 2006 to 2008, she was Chief of the DPRK (North Korea)
Affairs Division at the U.S. Department of State and was a member of the U.S.
delegation to the Six-Party Talks aimed at achieving the denuclearization of
North Korea; and

WHEREAS, in 2003 she was Chief of the Domestic Politics Unit for the U.S. Embassy in Seoul where she advised the Ambassador and senior officials in Washington on strategies for engaging incumbent and emerging political leaders in Korea and directed a staff of five (5) foreign service officers and local employees; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Kim served as the Special Assistant to the Secretary of
State in Washington D.C. managing official actions directed by and requested
by Secretary Colin Powell in 2002 and from 1996 to 2002 served as a PoliticalMilitary Officer for U.S. Embassies in Tokyo and Beijing working with the

U.S. military and the local governments manage political aspects related to the
 presence of U.S. forces in Japan and monitor China's relations with Japan,
 North Korea, and Mongolia; and

4 **WHEREAS**, in preparation for her next assignment as a Political 5 Counselor in Ankara, Turkey she is learning to speak Turkish in addition to 6 her fluency in Korean, Mandarin, Japanese, and French; and

7 WHEREAS, Ms. Kim who was also nominated to the 2009 Academy of 8 Our Lady of Guam's Hall of Fame attributes her accomplishments and 9 positive attitude as a result of the school's mission and philosophy coupled 10 with the relationships she has built with teachers and faculty of the Academy 11 of Our Lady of Guam; and

WHEREAS, in respect for her mother's legacy, Ms. Kim along with her father Mr. Kenneth J.R. Kim and brother Mr. Yeong-Sae Kim, award scholarships to deserving high school students looking to further their education at the University of Guam; and *now, therefore, be it*
