
I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN 2010 (SECOND) Regular Session

WHEREAS, Daniel Cristobal was born in Hagåtña on January 26, 1931, his proud parents, the late Carmen Untalan and the late Adriano Cristobal; was called to

his eternal reward on Sunday, August 15, 2010 at the venerable age of seventy-nine

WHEREAS, Daniel grew up in pre-war Hagåtña under the guidance and influence of the Spanish Capuchins. He became a Capuchin Friar in 1952 and was

ordained on July 2, 1959, as the first Chamorro Capuchin Priest; and

WHEREAS, His early years in the priesthood were spent assisting in Yona,

Saipan and Dededo. He has served as pastor in Dededo, Yona, Santa Rita, Sinajana,

Chalan Pago and Talofofo; and

WHEREAS, Fr. Daniel was tapped on many times in his ministry to organize

major events. In the historic visit of Pope John Paul II to Guam in 1981, a Capuchin,

Fr. Daniel Cristobal, OFM Cap, was tasked by then Bishop Felixberto C. Flores to

1 organize all the church preparations for that visit. Fr. Daniel was also appointed by 2 then Bishop Felixberto C. Flores to chair the Holy Year pilgrimage of the diocese in 3 1975, the Guam pilgrimage to the beatification of Blessed Diego Luis de San Vitores 4 in 1985, as well as other important events in the diocese. Fr. Daniel has also been 5 spiritual director for many organizations, including the Secular Franciscans, Cursillo 6 and Christian Mothers; now, therefore, be it 7 RESOLVED, that I Mina'Bente Nuebi Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, 8 on behalf of people of Guam, recognize the outstanding contributions, legacy and 9 services of the late Fr. Daniel Cristobal, OFM Cap. and extends sincere condolences 10 to his Family and the Capuchin Friars of Guam; and be it further RESOLVED, that the Speaker certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature 11 12 attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to 13 the Family of Fr.
