- 3 WHEREAS, family violence is a physical, sexual, emotional or verbal
- 4 violence directed against a person who is the abuser's intimate partner or
- 5 relative; and
- 6 WHEREAS, family violence affects people regardless of age, sexual
- 7 orientation, physical ability, marital status, ethnicity, culture, education,
- 8 religion, or economic status; and
- 9 WHEREAS, children in homes where abuse among adults occurs, are
- often neglected at a rate higher than the national average in the general
- 11 public; and

WHEREAS, studies show that children from violent homes have 1 higher risks of alcohol or drug abuse and juvenile delinquency; are six (6) 2 times more likely to commit suicide; twenty four (24) times more likely to 3 commit sexual assault crimes and fifty (50) times more likely to abuse 4 drugs or alcohol; and

WHEREAS, children from abusive homes carry terrible experiences of violence with them into adulthood and to the next generation; and

WHEREAS, Guam Police Department statistics show family violence-related offenses included two hundred four (204) cases of misdemeanor and felony family violence combined, five (5) cases of misdemeanor sexual assault, fifty tow (52) felony sexual assault with arrest of abuse and neglect – offenses against family and children, and 2 deaths as a result of family violence; and

WHEREAS, the Courts and Ministerial Division of the Superior Court of Guam reported four hundred seven (407) combined cases of felony and misdemeanor family violence; eighty seven (87) combined cases of felony and misdemeanor criminal sexual conduct, and ninety three (93) protection orders filings; and

WHEREAS, Probations Services Division reported six hundred ninety nine (699) new family violence, sexual assault and child abuse cases with nine hundred ninety seven (997) defendants under supervision by the end of 2009; and

WHEREAS, Alee Shelter, Erica's House, Public Defender Service

2 Corporation and the Attorney General's Office has provided one thousand

seven hundred thirty five (1,735) victims with direct services, and one

4 hundred sixty five (165) referrals to service providers; and

WHEREAS, family violence is often ignored and tolerated by our society, and many victims feel isolated, ashamed, and even responsible for the abuse, often blaming themselves; and

WHEREAS, many men and women are reluctant to admit to the incidence of violence and are reluctant to seek help beyond their families, and that experts believe that actual prevalence of family violence is much higher than statistics indicate; and

WHEREAS, the Family Violence and Sexual Assault Task Force, 12 STOP VAW subgrantees, government and non-government organizations, 13 faith-based organizations, and other community partners have joined 14 15 forces to directly confront this crisis, including: Alee Shelter – Catholic Social Services; Andersen Family Support Services – Fleet & Family 16 Support Services; Archdiocese of Agana; Attorney General of Guam -17 Department of Law, Crime Victim Response Unit; Department of 18 Corrections - Parole Division/Training; Department of Education; 19 Department of Mental Health and Substance Abuse - Healing Hearts Crisis 20 Center (HHCC); Department of Public Health and Social Services; 21 Department of Youth Affairs; Erica's House – Visitation Center; Governor's 22 Community Outreach - Federal Programs Office; Governor's Legal 23

- 1 Counsel; Guam Housing and Urban Renewal Authority; Guam Judiciary;
- 2 Guam Legislature; Guam Police Department Victim Assistance Unit;
- 3 Guma'Mami, Inc.; Inafa'Maolek; Mayors' Council of Guam; Media; Mothers
