Relative to recognizing and honoring seven (7) dedicated and courageous Veterans of the Republic of Korea (ROK) who served alongside U.S. Military Forces during the Vietnam War contributing their service and sacrifice for liberty, and now reside in our community as U.S. Citizens and as contributing residents.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA' TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

Whereas, the United States was the main thrust in the Vietnam-Laos Wars, six nations and many indigenous peoples from the region assisted and fought alongside U.S. soldiers. One of those Allies was the Republic of Korea (ROK); and

Whereas, the Republic of Korea (ROK) deployed 325,517 combat troops to Vietnam between 1964 and 1973 in support of the American war effort in that country. The number of ROK combat troops was second only to the United States itself, and far exceeded all other Allied contributions combined; and

Whereas, ROK troops were in Vietnam from 1964, and at its peak in 1967 the ROK troop presence in Vietnam was just over 50,000. The last soldier left Saigon on March 23, 1973; and

Whereas, 5,099 ROK soldiers were killed and 10,962 were injured; and

Whereas, Korean troops were known throughout the conflict for their fierce combat skills, and Korean units fought alongside American units in different areas of the theater to include Binh Dinh, Quang Ngai, Phu Yen, Khanh Hoa, Saigon, Da Nang, Qui Nhon, Cam Ranh, Nha Trang, Ninh Hoa, Dien, Vung Tau, and the Quang Nam provinces where each ROK unit was responsible for fighting the enemy by their own

initiatives and decisions; and
