Relative to recognizing and commending Dr. Richard W. Fee for his dedicated service to students, families, and prospective teachers in Special Education in the island of Guam.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTA NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

- 1 WHEREAS, Dr. Richard W. Fee was born in Philadelphia,
- 2 Pennsylvania and lived there until the age of six years old and moved to
- 3 Runameade, New Jersey thereafter; and
- 4 WHEREAS, as an adolescent, Dr. Fee was a less than exemplary
- 5 student, getting by with mere Bs and Cs, but decidedly made the
- 6 conscientious decision as a senior in high school to buckle down and
- 7 become an A student, resulting in his graduation from Triton High
- 8 School; and

WHEREAS, these concerted efforts to do well in school paid off,
as Dr. Fee was accepted into, attended, and graduated from the
University of Oklahoma where he obtained his Bachelor of Arts in
History in 1968; and
WHEREAS, upon graduation, Dr. Fee initially began his career
as a history teacher when he accidentally stumbled into the Sunshine
Cottage School for the Deaf in San Antonio, Texas, a private school for

WHEREAS, upon his epiphany, Dr. Fee returned to school and received his certification to be a teacher for the Deaf; and

the Deaf, where it was there that he found his calling for life; and

WHEREAS, upon getting his certification, Dr. Fee taught at the same school that had inspired him, the Sunshine Cottage School for the Deaf; and

WHEREAS, his passion led him to travel to Hong Kong where he privately tutored a deaf student for a period of two years, to travel to Montana State School to teach the Deaf and Blind, to travel to the

beautiful island of Guam to teach the Deaf at what is now known as
 Jose Rios Middle School; and

WHEREAS, his passion for teaching further led Dr. Fee to
Canberra Australia to work for the Ministry of Education as the Chief
Researcher for Special Education while simultaneously working on his
Masters of Education; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Fee endeavored to advance his education by attending the California State University in Northridge, California, where he was conferred a Master of Arts degree in Educational Administration in 1980; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Fee officially earned the title of Education

Specialist (Ed.S.) from the University of Idaho in 1998, and

subsequently earned his Ph.D. in Philosophy (Education) shortly

thereafter in 1999 from the same school, thereby becoming a double doctorate;

WHEREAS, since that time, Dr. Fee has devoted his life to
teaching and training education professionals in the field of Special

Education, with special interest in serving the Deaf community, and has served in many capacities, to include working as a Principal, a Chief Executive Officer, a Director, a Superintendent, an Adjunct Professor, an Educational Consultant, and now an Associate Professor;

WHEREAS, Dr. Fee has worked as an Associate Professor at the University of Guam since 2006, and as of Fall Semester 2010, Dr. Fee hooded his 90th graduate student;

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WHEREAS, Dr. Richard Fee is a highly sought-after speaker on Special Education, Deaf Education, and Cochlear Implants, and has done extensive traveling throughout the United States, Australia, South Africa, and to the Philippines, where he is applying for the Fulbright Scholarship to fund the very worthy project of providing training workshops to teachers for the Deaf and audiologists; now, therefore, be it

highly commend Dr. Richard W. Fee for his dedicated service in the area of Special Education in Guam; and be it further
