3 WHEREAS, Law Day has been designated as a wonderful occasion for the 4 recognition and celebration of our nation's great heritage of liberty, justice and 5 equality under the law; and

6 WHEREAS, a viable and lively democracy requires the understanding of the 7 nature and basis of the freedom that every American citizen enjoys today, and the 8 acknowledgement of the tremendous responsibility each individual has in the 9 representation of these freedoms; and

WHEREAS, Law Day provides an opportunity to celebrate the U. S. Constitution and the laws that protect our rights and liberties, and to recognize our responsibility as individual citizens to uphold the values of a free and just society for all; and

WHEREAS, in 1958, Law Day was established and proclaimed by President
Dwight D. Eisenhower, and was reaffirmed through a Joint Resolution by Members of
the U. S. Congress in 1961; and

WHEREAS, all citizens, both young and old, should understand their individual rights and responsibilities under the law to become effective and active participants in our nation's civil life, and positive contributors in society; and

WHEREAS, Law Day is celebrated annually on May 1st as a special day of celebration by the people of Guam and the nation, to join in the appreciation of every citizen's liberties, and to provide a unique time for a reflection and rededication of the ideals of equality and justice for all under the laws of the land; and

WHEREAS, the theme of Law Week 2011 is "The Legacy of John Adams:
from Boston to Guantanamo", which encourages individuals to reflect upon a

particular time in history which has contributed tremendously towards the formulation
 of laws that protect the interests of the general public; and

WHEREAS, Law Week 2011 will provide the people of Guam and the legal community with a chance to understand and appreciate the many challenges and opportunities that have confronted the legal community in the past, and that continue to confront the legal community today, and to consider the transformation of the justice system and the many programs that continue to support the island community; and

9 WHEREAS, during the course of Law Week 2011, and through the collective efforts of the Guam Bar Association, the Judiciary of Guam, and the U.S. District 10 11 Court of Guam, numerous events and presentations have been scheduled that will highlight the activities and services available within Guam's legal community for the 12 13 benefit of Guam's citizens, to include: Community Outreach Programs; the State of the Judiciary Address; Local and Federal Courthouse Tours; the Swearing-in 14 15 Ceremony for newly admitted Guam Bar members; the Fairy Tale Mock Trials by our island's youth; the Presentation of the *Hustisia* Award; the Naturalization Ceremony 16 and the Citizen Outreach Programs at the U.S. District Court of Guam; the Law Day 17 18 Art and Essay Contest; short seminars on a variety of topics from domestic to criminal 19 matters; and the Law Fair at the Micronesia Mall; now, therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, recognize and commend the Judiciary of Guam, the U.S. District Court of Guam, and the Guam Bar Association for the tremendous service that our legal community has provided, and continues to provide to all the people of Guam; and does further extend a warmhearted *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse'* and expresses gratitude and appreciation to all our law practitioners, judges, and support personnel within Guam's outstanding legal community, who continue to promote the proper and timely enforcement and interpretation of the law, and as the Guam community joins the nation in the national celebration of the Fifty Third (53rd) Anniversary of "Law Day" on May 1, 2011, and in the commemoration of Law Week 2011, from April 25 through May 1, 2011, with the unique theme of "The Legacy of John Adams: from Boston to Guantanamo"; and be it further
