- WHEREAS, Mr. Luis S.N. Reyes is married to Pacita A. Reyes, and they are
- 4 the parents of three (3) daughters. In 1961, Luis earned his General Education
- 5 Development (GED) from the University of Guam; and in 1973, he earned a Bachelor
- 6 of Arts (B.A.) Degree, with a Major in Psychology and a Minor in Sociology, from
- 7 the University of Guam, where he graduated Cum Laude. Luis then continued to

1 further his education, earning a Masters of Education Degree in Guidance and

Counseling from the University of Guam in 1974; and

WHEREAS, Luis' first job was working as a custodian with the federal civil service at the U.S. Naval Station, from August 1961 to September 1963; and he then worked as a part-time employee with the Port Authority of Guam, government of Guam, where he held the position of Clerk II, from September 1963 to January 1965; and

WHEREAS, Luis then began his career with the Department of Education, serving as a Guidance Counselor at *Barrigada* Junior High School, from August 1974

to April 1976; as the Head Guidance Counselor at Barrigada Junior High School,

11 from April 1976 to April 1980; as the Acting School Principal of Barrigada Junior

12 High School, from September 1977 to February 1978; as a School Program

13 Consultant, Personnel Services Division, from April 1980 to September 1980; as a

14 Personnel Specialist III, from October 1980 to October 1982; as the Acting Director of

15 Education, from August 1991 to September 1991; as an Assistant Administrator,

16 Personnel Services Division, from October 1982 to November 1992; again as the

17 Acting Director of Education, from September 1993 to February 1994; as the Acting

Superintendent of Education, from December 6, 2002 to December 20, 2002; and also

served as an Administrator, Personnel Services Division, from November 1992 to

20 May 2006; and

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WHEREAS, after nineteen (19) years of service with the Department of Education as School Guidance Counselor, School Assistant Principal, School Program Consultant, Personnel Specialist and Assistant Administrator, Luis had the sincere desire to contribute more to the education of over thirty-one thousand (31,000) public school students, and he agreed to serve as the Acting Director of Education, and he then became the Director of Education; and

1 WHEREAS. Luis has been a contributing member of the community, serving 2 as Chairman, Developmental Disabilities Planning Council, government of Guam; 3 Chairman, Board of Control, Department of Vocational Rehabilitation, government of 4 Rehabilitation Council, Division of Vocational Member, Guam Guam: 5 Rehabilitation; and as Chairman, Dr. Antonio Yamashita Educator Corps (YEC), College of Education, University of Guam; and 6 7 WHEREAS, through the years, Luis had participated as a Workshop Facilitator 8 and Planning Committee Member, Guam Conference of Handicapped Individuals in 1976; he was a Delegate to the Third (3rd) Annual Conference on Consumer & 9 10 Practitioners in Rehabilitation in Honolulu, Hawaii in 1977; he was a Delegate to the 11 First White House Conference on Handicapped Individuals by invitation and personal 12 appearance of President Jimmy Carter in Washington, D.C., in 1977; he headed the Delegation from Guam to the International Conference of the Handicapped in 1981; 13 14 he was a Panel Presenter at the Territorial Forum on Disabilities in Washington D.C. 15 in 1993; and he was the Keynote Speaker at the "Blueprint for Survival: A Chamorro Perspective", of the Second (2nd) Annual Commission's Institute on Cultural Diversity 16 in Washington, D.C., in September 1993, which was edited and featured on the 17 18 Micronesian Educator, Volume 4, 1993, A Journal of Research and Practice on 19 Education in Guam and Micronesia; and 20 WHEREAS, in recognition of his numerous contributions to Guam, Luis has 21 received several awards and honoraries, to include being inducted into Chi Omicron 22 Gamma; he was an Honorary Member of the Honorary Scholastic Society, University of Guam, 1973; he received the Meritorious Pay Award for outstanding performance 23 as Assistant Personnel Services Administrator, 1982; he was nominated as 24 25 Handicapped Employee of the Year, Office of the Governor, under the Magnificent Seven Program, 1988; he was the recipient of Professional Management Awards

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- 1 under the category of Persons with Disabilities, 1993; he was the recipient of the
- 2 Third (3rd) Annual Brave Heart Award, sponsored by the Kiwanis International
- 3 Organization of Taipei and the Taipei Kiwanis Club, and he and his family traveled to
- 4 Taipei, where he was the Keynote Speaker at the American School of Taipei for his
- 5 outstanding achievements as a person with disabilities; now therefore, be it
