Relative to commending and congratulating Dr. Mary L. Spencer on the occasion of her retirement from the University of Guam; and to further extending a most sincere Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse' to her for her outstanding contributions and continued service to Guam, and its people.

1 BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I* 2 *MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:*

3 WHEREAS, Dr. Mary L. Spencer was born in 1942, in Wichita, Kansas; and 4 she studied Psychology and Sociology at Wichita State University, and at the 5 University of Kansas; and by 1970, she had graduated with a Bachelor of Arts, a 6 Master of Arts, and Ph.D. in Psychology from the University of New Mexico; and WHEREAS, Dr. Mary L. Spencer taught at the University of Hawaii as an
 Assistant Professor of Psychology for two (2) years before moving to the San
 Francisco Bay Area, where she conducted research in cross-cultural and bilingual
 education for the next ten (10) years; and

5 WHEREAS, in 1981, at the invitation of Dr. Robert Underwood, Dr. Mary L. 6 Spencer first traveled to Guam to teach courses in language assessment, and 7 approaches to bilingual education instruction, to a group of teachers from Guam and 8 the outer islands of Micronesia,; and

9 WHEREAS, Dr. Mary L. Spencer returned to Guam in 1983 to serve as the 10 Assessment and Evaluation Specialist for the Bilingual Education Resource Center for 11 the Micronesian region, under a grant which was awarded to the University of Guam 12 by the U.S. Department of Education. Dr. Mary L. Spencer ultimately became the 13 Director of the Center, which was later known as Project BEAM (Bilingual Education 14 and Assistance in Micronesia), and served from December 1987 through December 15 1991; and

WHEREAS, in 1985, Dr. Mary L. Spencer was appointed to a tenure track position with the University of Guam as an Assistant Professor of Psychology; in 1888, she was then promoted to Associate Professor and awarded tenure; and in 1993, she was promoted to Professor of Psychology, which was later amended to Professor of Psychology and Micronesian Studies; and

WHEREAS, in 1991, Dr. Mary L. Spencer helped to establish the Micronesian Language Institute at the University of Guam, and she served as its Director until 1997, during which time she collaborated and researched the languages of Guam and Micronesia with noted scholars, such as Dr. Rosa Palomo, Marylee P. Palomares, Rosa Huffer Tacheliol, Alvios William and Usha Prasad. During this time, Dr. Mary L. Spencer wrote or edited five (5) books dedicated to the study of the language and orthography of the region, and she also edited ISLA: Journal of Micronesian Studies,
 and she had submitted several chapters to many other books related to her field of
 study; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Mary L. Spencer also worked closely with the Guam
Department of Education to develop oral language proficiency assessment
instruments, and she developed the first FSM National Standardized Tests of
Achievement, working with testing and assessment specialists in the Federated States
of Micronesia; and

9 WHEREAS, in 1997, Dr. Mary L. Spencer was promoted to Dean of the 10 College of Liberal Arts and Sciences, which was later renamed to the College of 11 Liberal Arts and Social Sciences, where she served for thirteen (13) years before 12 resigning to return to her faculty position in the Micronesian Language Institute, now 13 located in the Micronesian Area Research Center (MARC); and

WHEREAS, during her tenure as Dean, Dr. Mary L. Spencer wrote the first 14 15 NIH-funded Campus Suicide Prevention Grant, and served as its Acting Director 16 during its first year. She also supported numerous programs for students while 17 strengthening the infrastructure and resources within the College. Dr. Mary L. Spencer participated in the development of the new Master of Arts in English, the Graduate 18 19 Certificate in Micronesian Studies, and the Master of Science in Clinical Psychology degrees; and she had provided continuous support for the College's research 20 21 conferences, such as the Annual College Research Conference; the Annual Regional 22 Language Arts Conference; and the Annual CHamoru Language Competition; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Mary L. Spencer continues in her research of the languages of
Micronesia; and she contributes to the Center for Excellence in Developmental
Disabilities Education, Research & Service (CEDDERS); she is a member of the
Editorial Boards of the *Micronesian Educator: A Journal of Research and Practice on*

Education in Guam and Micronesia, and *Pacific Asia Inquiry;* she supervises several
 graduate students in Micronesian Studies; and she serves on the Doctoral Dissertation
 Committee at the Indiana University of Pennsylvania as a Guam scholar, while also
 maintaining her role on the Advisory Board of ISLA Center for the Arts; now
 therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Unu Na 6 Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the people 7 8 of Guam, commend and congratulate Dr. Mary L. Spencer on the occasion of her 9 retirement from the University of Guam, where she has served as an exemplary 10 member of the faculty and administration for the past twenty-eight (28) years; and 11 does further extend a most sincere Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse' to Dr. Mary L. Spencer for her outstanding contributions to the academic reputation of the University 12 of Guam, and for her commitment to the people of Guam and Micronesia; and be it 13 14 further
