10 WHEREAS, University of Guam (UOG) Accounting Professor Dr. Doreen 11 Crisostomo formed a four (4) member student team from her Fall 2011 BA401 12 "Government Accounting" class, of which Ms. Amber K. Castro was a member. 13 Under the guidance of Dr. Crisostomo, the team of Castro, Ms. Ruren G. Clemente, 14 Mr. Garry K. Yeoh, and Mr. Edward E. Brobesong entered into the AGA National's 15 competition to prepare a citizen-centric report for the city of Alexandria, Virginia, to 16 include a paper that summarizes the criteria and the justification the team used to 17 decide what information to include and exclude in the performance report; and

18 WHEREAS, the UOG team of Castro, Clemente Yeoh, and Brobesong 19 successfully placed as one (1) of the top three (3) finalist teams, along with Old 20 Dominion University, and the University of North Carolina at Pembroke; and

WHEREAS, all finalist teams were awarded scholarships to attend the AGA's 21 Tenth (10th) Annual National Leadership Conference in Washington, D.C., which the 22 23 UOG team accepted; and

WHEREAS, I Liheslaturan Guåhan, through the adoption of Resolution No. 24 25 308-31 (LS), recognized, commended, and offered its best wishes to the UOG team, which attended the Conference from February 16-17, 2012; and 26

WHEREAS, all three (3) finalist teams presented their finalized solutions on
 February 16, 2012, before a panel of judges and conference attendees, comprised of
 federal, state and local government leaders; corporate partners; and chief financial
 officers; and

5 WHEREAS, on February 17, 2012, the judges' selection was announced, and 6 the UOG team was selected as this year's Case Challenge winners; and in addition to 7 the honor and recognition of holding the position as this year's winning team, each 8 member of the team will also receive a cash prize and a free one (1) year AGA 9 membership; and

WHEREAS, the AGA followed through on its promise that this experience would challenge students' moral reasoning, raise their awareness of the importance of government accountability, and open doors to a future career in government; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Castro, her teammates, and their advisor, followed through on their promise to work their hardest and try their best, for themselves, for our university and for our island; now therefore, be it
