WHEREAS, since November 2007, Ms. Cerina Y. Mariano has worked as the
Program Coordinator for the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Program

(GCCCP) under the Bureau of Community Health Services (BCHS), Division Of
 Public Health, Department Of Public Health And Social Services; and

WHEREAS, Cerina has been instrumental in the work of GCCP, a federal program funded by the Centers for Communicable Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), whose primary goals are to prevent and reduce exposure to cancer risk factors; to improve access to and utilization of cancer screening, diagnosis, treatment, and related services; to enhance the quality of life for cancer survivors; to advocate for sustainable funding programs; and to promote a social and policy environment that is conducive to healthy lifestyles; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Mariano has been actively involved in the advocacy efforts for cancer and tobacco prevention and control efforts for the island of Guam, taking the lead in developing the first Guam Cancer Plan, Guam Cancer Facts and Figures, and the Cancer Passport Guide; and

WHEREAS, the first Guam Cancer Plan serves as the blueprint in implementing efforts which span the cancer continuum, addressing prevention, screening and treatment, data and research, policy and advocacy, and survivorship; and the Cancer Passport Guide provides general information about cancer, treatment options, questions you should ask your doctor, resources on Guam, and "messages of hope" or advice from a few of Guam's cancer survivors. The Cancer Passport Guide is also given, for distribution, to all physicians and clinics that diagnose patients; and

WHEREAS, Cerina has exemplified the traits of a true public servant, dedicating her time and endless efforts pulling people from all walks of life to help sustain the efforts of the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition, which works collaboratively in addressing and pursuing cancer prevention and control activities in our community; and 1 WHEREAS, Cerina has also shown her exemplary advocacy work in her role 2 and participation in the passage of Public Law 30-80, the biggest success in tobacco 3 prevention and control efforts, which increased the taxes on tobacco products in Guam by two hundred percent (200%). Included in the provision was the creation of a 4 5 Cancer Trust Fund, which provides financial support to cancer patients through community-based organizations which serve cancer patients and the Guam Cancer 6 7 Registry, with a percentage of the monies collected from the tobacco taxes allocated to 8 government health departments; and

9 WHEREAS, as a result of Cerina's work with the passage of Public Law 30-10 80, the Asian Pacific Partners for Empowerment, Advocacy & Leadership (APPEAL) 11 awarded the Guam Comprehensive Cancer Control Coalition for their efforts in 12 successfully advocating for the tobacco tax increase, which has been recognized as 13 one of the largest one-time tobacco tax increases in the nation; and

WHEREAS, Cerina has been pivotal in empowering the Guam Cancer Control
 Coalition to achieve all of these accomplishments, and has helped to ensure the
 successful day-to-day operations of the coalition; and

WHEREAS, Ms. Mariano's proven leadership skills and professional background in Social Work have been an invaluable asset to the Department of Public Health and Social Services because of her introduction of innovative ideas to improve the operations and effectively implement various prevention programs within the Bureau of Community Health Services; and

WHEREAS, Cerina will be departing from the Department of Public Health
 and Social Services to continue her advocacy work for the improved health of the
 people of Guam at the Pacific Island Health Officer's Association; now therefore, be it
 RESOLVED, that *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby,
 on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize, commend and extend a warm *Un*

Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'ase' to Ms. Cerina Y. Mariano for her work and
