WHEREAS, Commander Scott A. McKenzie is a native of Taylorsville, Utah;
and upon graduation from high school in May of 1980, he began his naval career as a
Seaman Recruit; and

WHEREAS, during his thirteen (13) year active duty enlisted career as a
 Hospital Corpsman and Preventive Medicine Technician, Commander Scott A.
 McKenzie progressed up to the rank of Chief Petty Officer, and had served at various
 duty stations, including aboard the USS Proteus, which was homeported in Guam.
 During this time, Commander McKenzie served in both Operation Desert Shield and
 Operation Desert Storm; and also served on numerous other shipboard and Marine
 Corps deployments; and

8 WHEREAS, upon completion of his Bachelor of Science Degree, Commander 9 McKenzie was commissioned as an Ensign in the Medical Service Corps in 10 September of 1993, and was assigned to the Naval Hospital in Newport, Rhode Island 11 for his first officer tour. He served as the Department Head for both the Preventive 12 Medicine and the Occupational Medicine Departments, and while serving there, he 13 achieved the rank of Lieutenant Junior Grade; and

14 WHEREAS, Commander McKenzie served our country in various other capacities at various duty stations, including as the Department Head for the 15 16 Preventive Medicine and Occupational Medicine Departments at the Naval Branch Medical Clinic in Mayport, Florida, after which he was promoted to the rank of 17 Lieutenant; as the Division Environmental Health Officer for the 2nd Marine Division 18 19 at Camp Lejeune in North Carolina, with the additional duties as the Deputy Division 20 Surgeon, during which time he earned a Master of Arts Degree in Public 21 Administration at Webster University; and he later served as the Director/Chief of 22 Service for Preventive Services at the Naval Hospital in Rota, Spain, where he was 23 promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Commander; and

WHEREAS, Commander McKenzie's other notable duty assignments include
 serving at the Naval Hospital at Camp Pendleton, California, where he was assigned
 as the Preventive Medicine Department Head. During this tour he was also deployed

to Iraq for eight (8) months, where he was assigned to the General's Staff for Multi-1

National Corps-Iraq, and served as the Theater Public Health Officer; and he had also 2

3 served as the Director of Preventive Medicine Technician School at the Naval School

4 of Health Sciences in San Diego, California; and

WHEREAS, Commander McKenzie was promoted to Commander while assigned to his current duty station at the U.S. Naval Hospital, Guam, where he 6 7 serves as Deputy Director, Branch Clinics, and Director of Public Health; and

8 WHEREAS, as Director of Public Health at the U.S. Naval Hospital, Guam, 9 Commander McKenzie served as the Department of Defense Representative on the Governor of Guam's Civilian-Military Task Force Subcommittee on Health and 10 Social Services, and on the Subcommittee on Public Safety; as well as on the 11 Governor of Guam's Pandemic Influenza Task Force, and the Food Safety Task 12 Force: and he was the Department of Defense Representative to the Guam Department 13 of Public Health and Social Services. 14

WHEREAS, Commander McKenzie's personal and military awards include: 15 16 the Bronze Star Medal; the Meritorious Service Medal; the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal (7 awards); the Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medal (5 17 18 awards); the Combat Action Ribbon (2 awards); and various other campaign and 19 service awards; and

WHEREAS, in addition to his exemplary service in the areas of health and 20 21 safety while stationed on Guam, Commander McKenzie also was active in the Aloha Council of the Boy Scouts of America, serving as the District Commissioner, the Boy 22 Scout Roundtable Commissioner, the Boy Scout Resident Camp Staff, and the Merit 23 24 Badge Counselor; and his work with the Boy Scouts was commendable and muchappreciated such that, in January of 2012, Commander McKenzie received the 25

prestigious Silver Beaver Award, making him the third (3rd) such recipient from Guam
 in the past thirty (30) years; and

WHEREAS, after thirty-two (32) years of honorable, exemplary, and
courageous service to our nation, our island and our people, Commander Scott A.
McKenzie will retire from the U.S. Navy on April 26, 2012; now therefore, be it
