- 3 WHEREAS, "Big Brothers Big Sisters of Guam" was incorporated in the
- 4 year 2000. It is an affiliate of "Big Brothers Big Sisters of America", the
- 5 nation's premier mentoring organization with over 300 agencies across the
- 6 country. Since its founding on Guam, over 700 children have been served.
- 7 Last year, "Big Brothers Big Sisters of Guam" supported 146 mentoring
- 8 matches; and

- 9 WHEREAS, it is the mission of the organization is to serve children
- facing adversity by providing one-to-one mentoring services with the help of
- positive role models. Mentorship is about developing positive relationships
- that have a direct and long lasting impact on the lives of young people; and,
- 13 WHEREAS, it is proven that by participating in our youth mentoring
- programs, Little "Brothers and Sisters" are 46% less likely to begin using

- illegal drugs, 27% less likely to begin using alcohol and 52% less likely to
- 2 skip school; and are more likely to enroll in a four-year university; and
- 3 WHEREAS, "Big Brothers Big Sisters of Guam" seeks to provide
- 4 quality volunteer and professional mentoring services for children and youth
- 5 and to assist the children in achieving their highest potential as they grow to
- 6 become responsible men and women.
- 7 WHEREAS, volunteer mentors from diverse backgrounds –
- 8 corporate community, the military community, government employees and
- 9 retirees, high school and college students --- all have devoted their time and
- efforts to positively influence youth around the island; and
- 11 WHEREAS, site-based mentoring programs are found at Price
- 12 Elementary School, Carbullido Elementary School, Upi Elementary School,
- 13 Tamuning Elementary School; FB Leon Guerrero Middle School, Agueda
- 14 Johnston Middle School, Untalan Middle School, Mount Carmel School,
- 15 Benavente Middle School and Santa Teresita Church; and
- 16 WHEREAS, community partners include the Department of
- 17 Education, Department of Youth Affairs, Department of Mental Health and
- 18 Substance Abuse and the Red Ribbon Committee. Big Brothers Big Sisters
- 19 continues to promote healthy choices through evidence-based programming
- and collaborations with likeminded organizations; and

- 22 employees through the Combined Federal Campaign effort, as well as
- 23 private foundations, such as the Beacon Foundation which helped raise
- 24 significant funds for Big Brothers Big Sisters agencies across the country;
