WHEREAS, the late Marian Johnston Taitano, was born on April 20, 1917,
in Hagåtña to William Gautier and Agueda Iglesias Johnston, and was called from
this life on March 15, 2011; and

6 WHEREAS, the late Marian Johnston Taitano was an active member of the
7 community fully participating in the social, political, civic, and commercial life of
8 Guam; and

9 WHEREAS, in the period before World War II, Marian Johnston Taitano was
10 one of the island's first female small business entrepreneurs as an owner and operator
11 of a beauty parlor which remained open even during the early years of the Japanese
12 Occupation; and

WHEREAS, the late Marian Johnston Taitano was well known for her civic work as a charter member of the Guam Memorial Hospital Volunteers Association and the Manenggon Memorial Foundation, as well as a leading member of the Guam Women's Club, the American Cancer Society, and many other civic organizations; and WHEREAS, the late Marian Johnston Taitano, as a proud American citizen was very much involved in the political life of the island as an active member of the Territorial Party of Guam and later the Democratic Party including serving as an advisor to the late Governor Ricardo J. Bordallo and running as the Democratic nominee for Senator (District III) in 1984; and

6 WHEREAS, the late Marian Johnston Taitano's involvement in public
7 affairs also extended to service on government boards including the Guam Election
8 Commission and the Guam Visitors Bureau; and

9 WHEREAS, the late Marian Johnston Taitano was also well known as an 10 articulate survivor of the World War II Japanese Occupation of Guam and witness to 11 the struggles of the Chamorro people during that period; and

WHEREAS, for this reason, the late Marian Johnston Taitano, was often called upon to relate her recollections and experiences of WWII in testimony before the Guam War Reparations Commissions and for many years was featured in news stories by local media and international news organizations such as Reuters as well as in documentaries about Guam's WWII experience such as Annette Donner's Man Libre; and

WHEREAS, as renown as the late Marian Johnston Taitano was for her personal attributes such as her beauty, talent for cooking and baking local delicacies and pastries, and ability as a dancer in several genres, she was even more well known for her generosity of spirit and her friendships with people of all walks of life and political parties; and

WHEREAS, for those who had the privilege of personally knowing her, the late Marian Johnston Taitano will fondly be remembered for her zest for life, her sharp wit, and the warmth of her heart which she freely shared with family, friends, and the island she loved so much; and
