RELATIVE TO RECOGNIZING LYDIA DIAZ TENORIO, BUREAU OF SOCIAL SERVICES **ADMINISTRATOR, GUAM DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEATLH AND SOCIAL** SERVICES ON THE OCCASION OF HER RECEIPT OF THE 2012 ADMINISTRATION ON CHILDREN, YOUTH AND FAMILIES, U.S. DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES COMMISSIONER'S AWARD FOR LEADERSHIP IN THE PREVENTION OF CHILD ABUSE AND NEGLECT AND TO HONOR HER FOR HER EXEMPLARY SERVICE IN CHILD WELFARE FOR OVER **30 YEARS.**

WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio began her government career as a Social 3 Worker in 1982 and has assumed increased responsibilities in various positions 4 now serving as Administrator for the Department of Public Health and Social 5 Services Bureau of Social Services Administration (BOSSA); and 6

WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio has exhibited outstanding leadership in 7 the field of child welfare and of human services on Guam throughout her years of 8 service always advocating for solutions working out of the "silos" to complex 9 children, youth and family problems; and 10

WHEREAS, many task forces, councils and inter-disciplinary teams have 11 benefited from the commitment and dedication of Lydia Diaz Tenorio over the 12 years including the Military Family Advocacy Committee, the Sexual Assault 13

Response Team Steering Committee, and the Healing Hearts Center serving for
 over 20 years; and

WHEREAS, Lydia Diaz Tenorio is a founding member of the Foster
Families Association ensuring support and promoting the mission of the
organization to help recruit foster families and support the children while in foster
care; and

WHEREAS, there have been many partnerships forged through the efforts 7 of Lydia Diaz Tenorio for and on behalf of BOSSA with community and nonprofit 8 organizations to promote civic participation in the care of children such as the 9 Kiwanis Club who sponsor Easter activities annually, the over 25 years of 10 sponsorship with the Sugar Plum Tree who give gifts to children and elderly on 11 Christmas, Harvest Christian Church who collaborate on foster care recruitment 12 and with Sanctuary, Incorporated and Catholic Social Services who provide 13 emergency shelter and residential care for homeless, abused and neglected 14 children; and 15

WHEREAS, understanding the importance and professional responsibility 16 to be participatory in policy, Lydia Diaz Tenorio has been active in the crafting of 17 bills that support program and policies that will strengthen a comprehensive and 18 responsive continuum of services for children and youth such as the child care 19 standards legislation, the elimination of the statutes of limitations for the reporting 20 of sexual assault against child victims, the establishment of a sexual assault 21 prevention education curriculum in all public schools and the revision of Juvenile 22 Justice codes including the Family Court and Child Protective Services Acts; and 23

WHEREAS, exhibiting good teamwork values and embracing the system of care concepts, Lydia Diaz Tenorio, assisted and contributed to the drafting and implementation of major federal grants such as from the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) to the Department of Mental Health & Substance Abuse to serve adolescents with Serious Emotional
Disturbances and a second grant to the Department of Public Health of Social
Services to develop Guam's Early Childhood System of Care where she served as
Interim Project Director providing much needed leadership to ensure the
infrastructure was in place and in compliance with grant requirements; and

6 WHEREAS, on January 3, 2012, the United States Department of Health 7 and Human Service, Administration on Children, Youth and Families, wrote to 8 inform Lydia Diaz Tenorio that she was selected to receive Commissioner Bryan 9 Samuels Award for exceptional contributions to the prevention and treatment of 10 child abuse and neglect on Guam; and

WHEREAS, because of Lydia Diaz Tenorio's consistent and remarkable work for Guam's children and families, depicting a high standard of service and deep commitment to her island, she is an inspiration to her staff, her colleagues, and the many community partners she has worked with over the years locally, regionally and nationally; and Now Therefore be it,

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, highly recognize Lydia Tenorio for her recent receipt of a national award recognizing her for her leadership in the prevention of child abuse and neglect and for her 30 years of service with the Guam Department of Public Health and Social Services and her overwhelming number of examples of extraordinary leadership and selfless contributions to the children, youth and families of Guam; and be it further
