Relative to memorializing and recognizing the accomplishments of the late Honorable Gregorio Acosta Calvo, former Commissioner/Mayor of Tamuning, for his accomplishments throughout his professional career and his lifetime

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

1	WHEREAS, Mr. Gregorio Acosta Calvo was born on November 9, 1924 and is
2	the son of Gregorio Leon Guerrero Calvo and Maria Acosta Calvo from the beautiful
3	village of Yigo; and
4	WHEREAS, Mr. Gregorio Acosta Calvo, also known as "Greg" to close family
5	and friends, has seven (7) brothers and sisters: Pedro, Rita, Maria, Manuel, Antonio,
6	Jose Flores and Antonio Flores; and
7	WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo attended the seventh grade at Nieves Memorial School
8	and soon afterwards the Japanese took over Guam on December 1941; and
9	WHEREAS, in 1945, the war was over and Mr. Calvo started working for Guam
10	Bus Line as a truck driver, driving from Agana to Umatac everyday; and

11	WHEREAS, in 1946, Mr. Calvo turned twenty-one (21) years old and married his
12	first love, Felisidad Salas and they have thirteen (13) beautiful children together;
13	Gregorio, Julie, Josefina, Linda, Anthony, Joseph, Marie, Mary, Manuel, Peter, Roque,
14	Johnny and Franc; and
15	WHEREAS, in 1952, Mr. Calvo started working for Department of Public Works
16	and was also the Chairman for Parks and Recreation; and
17	WHEREAS, in 1960, Mr. Calvo was first elected into Municipal Public Office as
18	Assistant Village Commissioner for four (4) years or one term for the beautiful village
19	of Tamuning; and
20	WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo then sought for and was elected as Tamuning-Tumon
21	village Commissioner, serving from 1965 to 1985, twenty (20) years, retiring with the
22	title as Village Mayor; and
23	WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo was a sports enthusiast. He formed, managed or coached
24	youth baseball, softball, and basketball teams in Tamuning; and
25	WHEREAS, in the late 1960's, Mr. Calvo worked for the youth betterment in
26	Tamuning by working with then Director Franklin Quitugua and Deputy Lola Nelson
27	to develop the large area below the Tamuning Elementary School for a baseball and
28	recreation area;

29	WHEREAS, today, that area is known as the Tamuning Recreation Park, a multi-
30	faceted baseball field for Little League, Girls and Seniors, which converts for football
31	and soccer and a basketball court; and
32	WHEREAS, in 1967, Mr. Calvo was selected as the first All-Star Manager to head
33	Guam's entry into the Little League Baseball Far East Tournament in Camp Zama,
34	Japan; and
35	WHEREAS, upon Mr. Calvo's return from Camp Zama, he was a changed man,
36	determining from then on that he forgave the Japanese for the island two-and-a-half-
37	year tragic occupation; and
38	WHEREAS, in 1975, during the planning of the first South Pacific Games to be
39	ever hosted by the Island of Guam, Mr. Calvo and former Senator Ted Nelson paved
40	the way with Department of Land Management by reserving almost 72 acres for an
41	island-wide sports complex, especially for international tournaments; and
42	WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo was Guam Little League Baseball District Administrator
43	for eighteen (18) years. He also served as the Northern Little League President and
44	Chairman of the Board; and
45	WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo attended all Far East Tournaments and traveled to the
46	Little League World Series many times; and

47	WHEREAS, one of Mr. Calvo's greatest joy was to watch the first of several
48	Guam entries into the Little League and Senior Little League World Series over the
49	years; and
50	WHEREAS, for many years, Mr. Calvo encouraged and saw the first fruits of
51	many Little League teams from Micronesia such as Saipan, Rota, Tinian, Palau, Chuuk,
52	Pohnpei and the Marshalls; and
53	WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo was very active in the Mobil Games with his son Peter, all
54	the years of its existence; and
55	WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo was always had a passion for baseball from the Little
56	League to the Senior League; and
57	WHEREAS, Mr. Calvo is a contemporary of such sports pioneers as the late
58	Pedro Rosario, who started the Guam Recreation Commission; Atanacio Salas of
59	Agana Heights; the late Guam Police Major Vicente Munoz, Guam's first Little League
60	District Administrator; the late Jose Guerrero, Guam's first umpire at the Little League
61	World Series in Williamsport Pennsylvania; and the late Mayor Gregorio Borja; They
62	are all pioneers, all builders and friends; now, therefore be it
63	RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'Trentai Unu Na Liheslaturan
64	Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, memorialize and highly
65	recognize Mr. Gregorio Acosta Calvo for all his accomplishments and for his selfless
66	service to the island and its community; and be it further

certify, and the Legislative Secretary attest to, the adoption hereof, and that copies of
