Relative to honoring and commending Chief Master Sergeant Vincent T. Adams on the occasion of his retirement from the United States Air Force and his committed military service for thirty (30) years and extend a warm *Un Dangkolo Na Si Yu'us Ma'ase* for his support and dedication to our island during his three (3) year assignment in Guam.

1 **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF**

2 *I MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:*

3 **WHEREAS**, Chief Master Sergeant Vincent T. Adams has committed thirty
4 (30) years of military service in the United States Air Force, to which 28 years are
5 in active service and is now celebrating his well-deserved retirement; and

6 **WHEREAS**, Chief Adams served as the Security Forces Manager, 36th
7 Security Forces Squadron Andersen Air Force Base in Guam for the duration of
8 three years during his assignment in the island; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Chief Adams was born in Stamford, Connecticut, on October
2 20, 1964, where he graduated from Stamford High School in June 1982, and
3 joined the US Air Force in December 1982; and

4 **WHEREAS**, Chief Master Sergeant Adams is married to the former
5 Magdalena M. Francisco of Carmen Rosales, Philippines to whom they have four
6 daughters, Maria, Mary, Laneasha, and Danica, and one son, Staff Sergeant Jamar
7 M. Adams; and

8 **WHEREAS**, during his time in the military services, Chief Adams
9 completed basic training and technical training at Lackland Air Force Base, Texas
10 and served as an Entry Controller, Security Controller, Alarm and Security
11 Response Team Leader, Area Supervisor, Flight Chief, Flight Leader, NCOIC,
12 Missile Operations Support, NCOIC, Security Operations, Superintendent,
13 Operations Flight, NCOIC, Installation Security, Superintendent, Security Forces
14 Administration and Chief, Training and Resources; and

15 **WHEREAS**, Chief Adams, a veteran of 28 years of active military service,
16 has completed all phases of Professional Military Education to which he was also a
17 Distinguished Graduate from the Noncommissioned Officer Academy, graduated
18 from the Air Base Ground Defense School Level II and was awarded Honor
19 Graduate; and

20 **WHEREAS**, his achievements in the military service continued to flourish,
21 where in 1997, he was selected as 35th Fighter Wing's Senior NCO of the Year and
22 Pacific Air Forces, Security Forces Staff, Senior NCO of the Year, in 2000, he was
23 selected 35th Support Group Senior NCO of the Year, and in 2002, he received the
24 highest SF honor, the Pacific Air Forces Colonel Billy Jack Carter Award for
25 outstanding efforts in force protection; and

1 **WHEREAS**, Chief Adams was also responsible for continuously defending
2 19,000 acres of resources valued at \$20 billion, where he led a security forces team
3 of 265 Active, Air National Guard, Reserve Airmen and civilian contractors; and

4 **WHEREAS**, he directed operations support programs, investigations, and
5 standardization and evaluation ensuring security forces personnel remain trained,
6 ready and equipped to defend forward deployed aircraft; and

7 **WHEREAS**, he also served as the principle advisor to the commander on
8 enlisted matters concerning unit fitness, standards of conduct, military
9 bearing/behavior, awards/decorations, and discipline as well as functional manager
10 for all unit manpower and coordinates with PACAF, and AFPC, and provides force
11 protection to a population of 9,000 personnel against all threats; and

12 **WHEREAS**, Chief Adams was a very well-respected leader who
13 continuously served the best interest for those he had led and the best interest of
14 the United States; and

15 **WHEREAS**, during his time in Guam, he had also contributed in various
16 community outreach activities to assist the needy in our island community, where
17 he worked as a member of the Protestant Men of
18 the Chapel (PMOC) Ministry at the Andersen Chapel, he also served as a group
19 leader involved with raising funds and donating clothes to the village of Yigo; and

20 **WHEREAS**, on several occasions, they would go out and cook and feed the
21 homeless at the Food Shelter in Agana and other activities such as the ministry
22 donated school bags two years in a row to the Machanaonao Elementary School,
23 and, as the Security Forces Manager, he was involved with the events during
24 Police week with Guam Police Department; and

25 **WHEREAS**, Chief Adams now celebrates his well deserved retirement in
26 Goodfellow Air Force Base in Texas; and now, be it further

1 **RESOLVED**, *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people of Guam, honor and
2 commend Chief Master Sergeant Vincent T. Adams on the occasion of his
3 retirement and extend a warm *Un Dangkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'ase'* for his
4 committed support and dedication in serving the United States and the island of
5 Guam during his time of assignment to our island; and be it further

6 **RESOLVED**, that the Speaker and the Chairperson of the Committee on
7 Rules certify, and the Secretary of the Legislature attest to, the adoption hereof,
8 and that copies of the same be thereafter transmitted to Chief Master Sergeant
9 Vincent T. Adams; and to the Honorable Edward J.B. Calvo, *I Maga'lahen*
10 *Guåhan*.
