Relative to recognizing and congratulating Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag, on the occasion of her retirement from the Department of Education and for a lifetime of distinguished service as an academic, consummate professional, volunteer, and business woman and to further extend an *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse* for her selfless and tenured commitment to serving our youth, women, and families in their personal, educational, and professional development.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA'TRENTAL UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag is an academic, consummate professional, and volunteer whose distinguished career spans service in public and private education, private industry, and as an entrepreneur; and,

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag, over the course of fifty-four years has contributed a lifetime of service that has touched the lives of countless numbers of students and families as well having enriched the communities and organizations of which she was a member to; and,

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag began her career in June of 1958,
 as an English teacher at St. Theresa's College, Manila, High School Professional
 Catechist (Public School) under Brothers of De La Salle Christian School; and

WHEREAS, in June 1960, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag worked for De La Salle Grade School, Taft Avenue, Manila as a department chairperson and guidance counselor where she performed psychological testing, student assessment, individual and group counseling, and developed parental involvement programs; and

WHEREAS, in June 1972, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag continued on as the department chairperson and guidance counselor with La Salle High School, Greenhills, Mandaluyong, Rizal, where she also taught and concurrently served as adjunct faculty of the Graduate Guidance Department; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag advanced in her teaching track and in June of 1975 was promoted to associate professor and guidance counselor, atop her duties as department chairperson at De La Salle University, Manila, Philippines where she was responsible for the design & implementation of multi-disciplinary programs; career guidance; teaching in college, graduate school, and continuing education programs for parents and faculty; research & textbook writing; college thesis mentoring; continuing staff development and training and evaluation; and where, in a couple of years, she participated in an Observation / Consultation Tour in the United States relative to community programs from California to New York that subsequently led to her starting a campus ministry program at De La Salle University; and

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag, pursued a position in October of 1980 with Malayan Insurance Company as the personnel and human resource manager with responsibility of over 1,000 employees and ten active employee union where she conducted employee assessments; career & vocational counseling; on the

cost reduction programs, contract bargaining agreements, improving work

3 performance, and effective work habits; and

WHEREAS, from October of 1982 to June of 1993, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag, served as president of a private firm for effectiveness training & management consultancy where she conducted vocational programs for "out of school" youth under the Office of the President of the Philippines and as subsidized by the World Bank. Such programs included training for managers, supervisors, and employees; vocational and career counseling; training on effective work habits, values & attitudes, team building, supervision, improving employee performance, and organizational assessments, thereby earning the firm national recognition for 10 years as a Top Training Institution in the Philippines; and

WHEREAS, from October 1993 to June of 1996 she served as a guidance counselor at St. Anthony School, Tamuning, Guam, where she provided individual & group counseling; taught 7th grade classes; conducted psychological testing and assessments of referred students; group guidance activities; student leadership training; workshops on conflict resolution and anger management; and where she was also a Rainbows Facilitator for training about sex education as well as conducted staff development and parenting skills program; and,

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag conducted community outreach in collaboration with *Ina'fa Maolek*, Alee Shelter, Department of Youth Affairs, and numerous other organiations on Guam; and,

WHEREAS, from October of 1993 to June of 1998 Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag served as the Director of Family and Youth Ministry for the Archdiocese of Agana where she conducted research, planned programs, trained, implemented and

1 evaluated programs relative to family and youth in 24 parishes of the Archdiocese;

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag further faithfully served our youth by conducting leadership training for youth; organized World Youth Day Events locally and internationally; and initiated the Teen Abstinence program, as well as Family and Youth Stand Against Family, and Individual, Couple, and Family Counseling; and,

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag was involved and successful in grant writing where she secured a five year grant to the Archdiocese of Hagatna, Guam from the Catholic Extension Society of Chicago for the development and implementation of programs for Family and Youth projects for the 24 parishes in the Archdiocese; in addition to securing a grant from the Institute of Parenting for Peace and Justice Network in St. Louis Missouri; and,

WHEREAS, from August of 1998 to present, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag served as a guidance counselor for the Guam Department of Education at Maria A. Ulloa Elementary School where she conducted psychological testing & assessment of referrals; individual and group counseling of children referred for behavior and learning problems; provided support programs for teachers and parents (Helping the Disruptive Child, Skills Training for Children with Behavior Problems, Training For Remediation and Intervention, Behavior Modification Programs, Peacemaking Program for Safe Home-School- Community, Chairing Child Study Team Meetings, Retention & Promotion assessments, SAT 9 interpretation workshops for administration, teachers, and parents and other intervention programs as seen helpful for the school community; and,

WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag was instrumental in the design and implementation of home-school community outreach programs; authoring of the

school leadership improvement plan grant; department of education extended day 1 2 program; and for other administrator and teacher programs; and, 3

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WHEREAS, Dr. Josephine Cenzon Caluag has accomplished a tenured and distinguished career as a professional, entrepreneur, advocate for youth, women, and families, and as a citizen volunteer working to improve the living and learning conditions of men and women in her profession, education, and in her place of worship. She has, with dignity, class, and a profound degree of success, established a standard of excellence for many to follow; now therefore, be it
