**Relative to recognizing and congratulating Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag, on the occasion of her retirement from the Department of Education and for a lifetime of distinguished service as an academic, consummate professional, volunteer, and business woman and to further extend an *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse* for her selfless and tenured commitment to serving our youth, women, and families in their personal, educational, and professional development.**

1           **BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I**  
2 ***MINA'TRENTAI UNU NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:***

3           **WHEREAS,** Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag is an academic, consummate  
4 professional, and volunteer whose distinguished career spans service in public and  
5 private education, private industry, and as an entrepreneur; and,

6           **WHEREAS,** Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag, over the course of fifty-four years  
7 has contributed a lifetime of service that has touched the lives of countless numbers  
8 of students and families as well having enriched the communities and organizations  
9 of which she was a member to; and,

1           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag began her career in June of 1958,  
2 as an English teacher at St. Theresa's College, Manila, High School Professional  
3 Catechist (Public School) under Brothers of De La Salle Christian School; and

4           **WHEREAS**, in June 1960, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag worked for De La  
5 Salle Grade School, Taft Avenue, Manila as a department chairperson and guidance  
6 counselor where she performed psychological testing, student assessment, individual  
7 and group counseling, and developed parental involvement programs; and

8           **WHEREAS**, in June 1972, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag continued on as the  
9 department chairperson and guidance counselor with La Salle High School,  
10 Greenhills, Mandaluyong, Rizal, where she also taught and concurrently served as  
11 adjunct faculty of the Graduate Guidance Department; and

12           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag advanced in her teaching track and  
13 in June of 1975 was promoted to associate professor and guidance counselor, atop her  
14 duties as department chairperson at De La Salle University, Manila, Philippines  
15 where she was responsible for the design & implementation of multi-disciplinary  
16 programs; career guidance; teaching in college, graduate school, and continuing  
17 education programs for parents and faculty; research & textbook writing; college  
18 thesis mentoring; continuing staff development and training and evaluation; and  
19 where, in a couple of years, she participated in an Observation / Consultation Tour in  
20 the United States relative to community programs from California to New York that  
21 subsequently led to her starting a campus ministry program at De La Salle University;  
22 and

23           **WHEREAS**, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag, pursued a position in October of  
24 1980 with Malayan Insurance Company as the personnel and human resource  
25 manager with responsibility of over 1,000 employees and ten active employee union  
26 where she conducted employee assessments; career & vocational counseling; on the

1 job training for quality control; training in leadership excellence, time management,  
2 cost reduction programs, contract bargaining agreements, improving work  
3 performance, and effective work habits; and

4       **WHEREAS**, from October of 1982 to June of 1993, Dr. Josephine Cenzone  
5 Caluag, served as president of a private firm for effectiveness training & management  
6 consultancy where she conducted vocational programs for “out of school” youth  
7 under the Office of the President of the Philippines and as subsidized by the World  
8 Bank. Such programs included training for managers, supervisors, and employees;  
9 vocational and career counseling; training on effective work habits, values &  
10 attitudes, team building, supervision, improving employee performance, and  
11 organizational assessments, thereby earning the firm national recognition for 10 years  
12 as a Top Training Institution in the Philippines; and

13       **WHEREAS**, from October 1993 to June of 1996 she served as a guidance  
14 counselor at St. Anthony School, Tamuning, Guam, where she provided individual &  
15 group counseling; taught 7<sup>th</sup> grade classes; conducted psychological testing and  
16 assessments of referred students; group guidance activities; student leadership  
17 training; workshops on conflict resolution and anger management; and where she was  
18 also a Rainbows Facilitator for training about sex education as well as conducted staff  
19 development and parenting skills program; and,

20       **WHEREAS**, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag conducted community outreach in  
21 collaboration with *Ina'fa Maolek*, Alee Shelter, Department of Youth Affairs, and  
22 numerous other organizations on Guam; and,

23       **WHEREAS**, from October of 1993 to June of 1998 Dr. Josephine Cenzone  
24 Caluag served as the Director of Family and Youth Ministry for the Archdiocese of  
25 Agaña where she conducted research, planned programs, trained, implemented and

1 evaluated programs relative to family and youth in 24 parishes of the Archdiocese;  
2 and,

3       **WHEREAS**, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag further faithfully served our youth  
4 by conducting leadership training for youth; organized World Youth Day Events  
5 locally and internationally; and initiated the Teen Abstinence program, as well as  
6 Family and Youth Stand Against Family, and Individual, Couple, and Family  
7 Counseling; and,

8       **WHEREAS**, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag was involved and successful in  
9 grant writing where she secured a five year grant to the Archdiocese of Hagatna,  
10 Guam from the Catholic Extension Society of Chicago for the development and  
11 implementation of programs for Family and Youth projects for the 24 parishes in the  
12 Archdiocese; in addition to securing a grant from the Institute of Parenting for Peace  
13 and Justice Network in St. Louis Missouri; and,

14       **WHEREAS**, from August of 1998 to present, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag  
15 served as a guidance counselor for the Guam Department of Education at Maria A.  
16 Ulloa Elementary School where she conducted psychological testing & assessment of  
17 referrals; individual and group counseling of children referred for behavior and  
18 learning problems; provided support programs for teachers and parents (Helping the  
19 Disruptive Child, Skills Training for Children with Behavior Problems, Training For  
20 Remediation and Intervention, Behavior Modification Programs, Peacemaking  
21 Program for Safe Home-School- Community, Chairing Child Study Team Meetings,  
22 Retention & Promotion assessments, SAT 9 interpretation workshops for  
23 administration, teachers, and parents and other intervention programs as seen helpful  
24 for the school community; and,

25       **WHEREAS**, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag was instrumental in the design and  
26 implementation of home-school community outreach programs; authoring of the

1 school leadership improvement plan grant; department of education extended day  
2 program; and for other administrator and teacher programs; and,

3 **WHEREAS**, Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag has accomplished a tenured and  
4 distinguished career as a professional, entrepreneur, advocate for youth, women, and  
5 families, and as a citizen volunteer working to improve the living and learning  
6 conditions of men and women in her profession, education, and in her place of  
7 worship. She has, with dignity, class, and a profound degree of success, established  
8 a standard of excellence for many to follow; now therefore, be it

9 **RESOLVED**, that the Committee on Rules of *I Mina'Trentai Unu Na*  
10 *Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby on behalf of *I Liheslaturan Guåhan* and the people  
11 of Guam does hereby recognize and congratulate Dr. Josephine Cenzone Caluag on the  
12 occasion of her retirement from the Department of Education and for a lifetime of  
13 distinguished service as an academic, consummate professional, volunteer, and  
14 business woman and to further extend an *Un Dångkolo Na Si Yu'os Ma'åse* for her  
15 selfless and tenured commitment to serving our youth, women, and families in their
