Relative to conveying the condolences and the deep sadness of the people of Guam on the occasion of the passing of a great friend of Guam, the late Senator Daniel K. Inouye of Hawai'i.

- 3 WHEREAS, United States Senator and most senior member of the United States Senate, the Honorable Daniel K. Inouye of Hawai'i, passed 4
- away on December 17, 2012, at the age of 88; and 5
- WHEREAS, Senator Inouye, the son of Japanese immigrants, was 6
- 7 born in Honolulu, Hawai'i, on the 7th of September, 1924; and

8 WHEREAS, following the attack at Pearl Harbor on December 7, 1941, Senator Inouye joined the United States Army as a private in 1943, 9 and during the Second World War won the Bronze Star, Purple Heart 10 Distinguished Service Cross, later upgraded to 11 and the the Congressional Medal of Honor in 2000, for his bravery in battle, in 12 13 which he was grievously wounded; and

WHEREAS, although Senator Inouye lost his right arm due to 14 15 military action, he remained in Army until 1947 when, with the rank of

1 Captain, he was honorably discharged; and

2 WHEREAS, at the time of his passing, Senator Inouye, a 3 Democrat, was the longest serving member of the United States Senate, represented Hawai'i as a member of the House 4 having of Representatives when the islands first joined the union in 1959, 5 6 becoming a member of the United States Senate in 1962, and eventually 7 achieving the positions of Chairman of the Senate Appropriations 8 Committee, Chairman of the Subcommittee on Defense, and President 9 Pro Tempore of the Senate, which is third in line of Presidential 10 succession; and

WHEREAS, Senator Inouye was also well known as a champion of the rights and interests of Pacific Islanders, including the people of Guam, and his passing is a loss not only to the state of Hawai'i and our great nation, but especially to those of us in the Pacific who greatly admired Senator Inouye's strong leadership and interest in the concerns of the Pacific region; now therefore be it
