BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA TRENTAL SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN:

WHEREAS, one of the most tragic and horrific events in our island's history occurred during World War II, from December 8, 1941 to August 10, 1944; and the ATTEMENTS, one of the most tage, and not increase in the salary in our salary is most year that the enemy forces inflicted upon the people of Guant have left scars that will never heal. CHaumorus were enslaved and forced to work for little to no compensation, and many families suffered the loss of personal property and their livelihoods. The rape of women was rampant, while children were unfairly robbed of their innocence. Thousands of CHaumorus were subjected to physical abuse, detention, and torture, and more than a thousand residents were killed by the Japanese Imperial Army. The heinous acts that resulted in the deaths of many of our native inhabitants was truly tragic and traumatic; and in the end, the peaceful way of life that the CHamoras had and cherished before the war was lost forever; and WHEREAS, on November 15, 1945, the U.S. Congress passed Public Law 79-225, "The Meritorious Claims Act of 1945." The Act authorized the Secretary of

the Navy to adjudicate and settle claims "for the purpose of granting immediate relief to the residents of Guam by the prompt settlement of meritorious claims."

Although Guam had a surviving population of about twenty-one thousand (21,000) residents, only six thousand six hundred forty-six (6,646) claims were filed. This number was significantly lower than expected considering that almost every individual who was on Guam during the occupation was subjected to humiliation, beatings, and/or loss of property; and

WHEREAS, as Guam continues to fight for appropriate recognition of those who suffered during the war from the U.S. Congress, we must do everything we can here on Guam to honor the memories and the stories of those who endured permanent sufferings. The legacy and heritage of our war survivors, known as our Gratati

Generation, should be recognized by all the people of Guam; and "War Survivor Remembrance Day" is an appropriate day to honor the war survivors who have gone
before us, to celebrate the lives of those still with us, and to remind all future generations that they must never forget the Greatest Generation in our island's history; and

WHEREAS, on June 26, 2015, Guam Public Law 33-56 was enacted declaring that June 28 of each year be recognized as "War Survivor Remembrance Day." The date is important since it marks the day that President Harry S. Truman transmitted a request to the U.S. House of Representatives for consideration of an appropriation for the Navy Department to pay claims for death or personal injury to residents on Guam for suffering through the war, and in recognition of the CHamoru people who endured one of the most tragic and horrific enemy occupations; and

WHEREAS, to help ensure that the sacrifice and legacy of Guam's war survivors is truly perpetuated for years to come, the Guam War Survivors Memorial Foundation organizes events that eater to all age groups and walks of life. These events include a Memorial Mass that is held every year at the Duke Nowbre de Maria Cathedral Basilica and a concert series dedicated to the survivors of World War II, featuring the music from that era; and the Foundation has published books featuring the inspiring and heart-wrenching stories of survivors and their families; and

WHEREAS, the Guam War Survivors Memorial Foundation also developed a website that is dedicated to allowing survivors or their families with an outlet to share the hardships they faced during the Japanese Occupation. Before the website was created, former Senator Frank Blas Jr., President of the Guam War Survivors Memorial Foundation, his senatorial staff, their friends from Expressions Studio, and companies who wanted to help, started a weekly series in the Guam edition of the Marianas Variety newspaper called "Real People. Real Stories." They provided transcribed testimonies from the war survivors who spoke before the Guam War Claims Review Commission in December of 2003. "Real People. Real Stories" was created to educate the community about the horrendous experiences of the CHamoru people during the war and to remind the U.S. government of its obligation to compensate those who survived the war, and the heirs of those who were killed; now therefore,
