Relative to requesting that the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry, and the Department of Defense select Guam as one of eight sites to be studied for the possible health implications of polyfluoroalykl substances and that the Department of Defense immediately initiate actions to address elevated levels of polyfluoroalykl substances in water wells previously operated by the military and returned to the people of Guam and those water wells also affected by the use of firefighting foam containing perfluorooctanesulfonic acid by the military on Guam.

- 3 WHEREAS, perfluorooctanesulfonic acid (PFOS), perfluorooctanic acid
- 4 (PFOA), and other polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFASs) are chemicals that have been
- 5 found to cause thyroid disease, testicular and kidney cancer, ulcerative colitis, and
- 6 pregnancy induced hypertension, among others; and
- WHEREAS, the United States acknowledges the dangers of PFASs as
- 8 evidenced by the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives having passed the 2018

- 1 National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) with provisions that address
- 2 contamination from PFASs; and
- 3 WHEREAS, the NDAA includes Seven Million Dollars (\$7,000,000) to begin
- 4 a five (5) to seven (7) year health study on populations exposed to PFOS firefighting
- 5 foam in eight (8) different sites; Forty-Two Million, Two Hundred Thousand Dollars
- 6 (\$42,200,000) to the Navy for firefighting foam remediation, Thirty Million Dollars
- 7 (\$30,000,000) to the Air Force for firefighting foam remediation, and a six (6) month
- 8 deadline for the Department of Defense to submit a report on the progress in
- 9 developing new firefighting foams that phase out PFOS; and
- WHEREAS, PFOS has been introduced to Guam's environment by the military
- in firefighting foams heavily used in training at the former Naval Air Station (NAS) in
- 12 Tiyan up through its closing in 1995; and
- 13 WHEREAS, safe levels of PFAS contamination have been determined by the
- 14 United States Environmental Protection Agency (USEPA) to be seventy (70) parts per
- 15 trillion (ppt); and
- WHEREAS, safe levels of PFAS contamination have been determined by state
- 17 agencies to be even lower, such as that of the New Jersey Department of
- 18 Environmental Protection, that has set the safe levels of PFAS contamination to
- 19 fourteen (14) ppt; and
- WHEREAS, safe levels of PFAS contamination have been suggested by some
- 21 researchers in the United States and Denmark to be even lower than some state
- determinations at one (1) ppt; and
- WHEREAS, PFASs have been detected in Guam water wells at levels well
- over the USEPA's safe level of seventy (70) ppt, specifically at water wells NAS-1,
- 25 A-23, and A-25; and

1 WHEREAS, water well NAS-1 is a water well located on land previously used 2 by the military at the former NAS located in Tiyan and subsequently returned to the 3 people of Guam; and 4 WHEREAS, water wells A-23 and A-25 are water wells located downhill from 5 the former NAS located in Tiyan; and 6 WHEREAS, the people of Guam have consumed dangerous levels of PFOS for 7 decades, though NAS has been closed since 1995, high levels of PFOS is currently 8 being detected; and 9 WHEREAS, in living organisms, PFAS binds to protein albumin in the blood, 10 liver and reproductive organs causing reproductive and developmental effects on fetuses, testicular and kidney cancer, and immunological effects in laboratory studies; 11 12 and 13 WHEREAS, PFAS contamination is clearly a public health risk to Guam's people caused by the exposure of PFOS to the island during the military's use of 14 firefighting foam; now, therefore, be it 15 16 **RESOLVED**, that *I Mina'Trentai Singko Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, 17 on behalf of the people of Guam respectfully request that the Centers for Disease 18 Control and Prevention, the Agency for Toxic Substances and Disease Registry, and 19 the Department of Defense select Guam as one (1) of eight (8) sites to be studied for 20 the possible health implications of PFAS on human health; and be it further **RESOLVED**, that I Mina'Trentai Singko Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, 21 22 on behalf of the people of Guam respectfully request that the Department of Defense immediately initiate actions to address elevated levels of PFAS in water wells 23 24 previously operated by the military and returned to the people of Guam and those 25 water wells also affected by the use of firefighting foam containing PFOS by the
