**Relative to recognizing Rear Admiral Shoshana Chatfield, Commander-Joint Region Marianas, and commending her for her leadership and contributions to the island of Guam; and to further congratulating her on being appointed to serve as the first female President of the Naval War College.**

**BE IT RESOLVED BY I MINA TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:**

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Shoshana Chatfield has led the Joint Region Marianas (JRM) to the highest levels of installation readiness in maintaining the U.S. Department of Defense's only Joint Region, which combined installation support services for U.S. Naval Base Guam and Andersen Air Force Base; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Chatfield masterfully unified the Officers, Sailors, Airmen, Marines, and civilians to navigate the complex political, financial and technical issues encompassing all matters affecting the entire Joint Region. The scope of her responsibility included the management of policy for and the execution of installation support to over fifty (50) Joint Commands located on two (2) geographically separate installations across thirty-two thousand (32,000) acres of land on the island of Guam, as well as support to operational units of the Fifth and Seventh Fleets and Air Forces Pacific; and

WHEREAS, in 2018, the island of Guam and the Commonwealth of the Northern Mariana Islands (CNMI) were hit with back to back typhoons, Typhoon *Mangkhut* and Super Typhoon *Yutu*. These natural disasters crippled the infrastructure in Saipan and Tinian, and required the activation of Task Force West (TF-W) Headquarters (HQ) and the TF-W Title 10 Deputy to the Dual Status Commander for Guam. It was through her leadership that the TF-W provided vital information up to the Theater Commander Level, the U.S. Indo-Pacific Command, the Theater Component Commander, and the Theater Joint Force Land Component Commander under the U.S. Army Pacific, and to functional combatant commanders, including the Guam National Guard, Government of Guam officials, the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and in coordination with the CNMI state and local government officials in order to prevent loss of life, mitigate suffering, and reduce the scope of the disaster. Over the course of the operation, Joint Task Group Saipan was instrumental in providing lifesaving support and reducing the suffering among the fifty thousand (50,000) residents of Saipan; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Chatfield provided critical sustainment training for forward deployed U.S. Forces, and she supported joint operations and multinational exercises with the armed forces of Australia, Canada, France, India, Japan, the Philippines, the Republic of Korea, and Singapore during numerous operations and exercises; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Chatfield's efforts enhanced cooperative operational capabilities, and her superlative management of these vital training assets has had a direct impact on and provided tremendous support to our nation's rapidly emerging regional focus to strengthen relationships with our allied partners and to affect stability, prosperity, and maritime security throughout the Pacific region in support of the National Security Strategy; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Shoshana Chatfield oversaw the conduct of regional exercises for disaster response, the Defense Support for Civil Authorities (DSCA) training and exercises with federal partners, local authorities and the private sector, and thereby strengthening Guam's all-hazard preparedness. JRM is the only Region in the CNIC enterprise with an operational requirement to perform as the Defense Coordinating Officer (DCO) West with a Defense Coordinating Element (DCE) for DSCA, as well as TF West for disasters and foreign Humanitarian Assistance/Disaster Relief (HA/DR). The unity of effort was vital to reinforcing the island's self-reliance in the absence of immediate external assistance due to our geographic isolation and limited opportunity for supply and aid reception; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Chatfield conducted a comprehensive regional partnership outreach plan in her area of operations. Her efforts included further integrating joint forces within her area of operation, as well as a robust "One Guam" campaign which included dozens of speaking engagements and public appearances across the Marianas and throughout Micronesia. These efforts provided information and stability for regional partners in advance of the military buildup on Guam and the CNMI; and

WHEREAS, in partnership with the executive administration of the Governor of Guam, the JRM responded to multiple inquiries related to the military buildup and the associated U.S. Marine Corps (USMC) relocation to Guam; and


WHEREAS, on June 14, 2019, Rear Admiral Shoshana Chatfield was appointed to lead the Naval War College; and is the first woman to lead the Naval War College since its inception in 1884, one hundred thirty-five (135) years ago; and

WHEREAS, Rear Admiral Shoshana Chatfield oversaw the successful facilities and environmental program execution of \$210 Million Dollars in Base Operating Services, \$195 Million Dollars in Facilities Sustainment, Restoration and Modernization, and \$603 Million Dollars in Military Construction, ensuring continued infrastructure support to the joint military force; and in turn, contributing to the economy of Guam; and her respect for the residents of Guam and her love of this island she has twice called home during her superlative naval career have forged the partnerships and set the path for a way forward for the U.S. Navy, the U.S. Department of Defense, and the island of Guam; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that I *Mina Trentai Singko Na Liheslaturan Guåhan* does hereby, on behalf of the people of Guam, recognize Rear Admiral Shoshana Chatfield, Commander-Joint Region Marianas, and commend her for her leadership and contributions to the island of Guam; and does further congratulate her on being appointed to serve as the first female President of the Naval War College; and be it further


