Furthering her aspirations to become a medical doctor, LCDR Lentz attended Harvard Medical School in Boston, Massachusetts from September 1994 to February 1996, attaining her Master's degree; and in May 2011, she obtained her Doctor of Medicine degree graduating cum laude from the University of Maryland School of Medicine in Baltimore, Maryland; and she received training at Duke University Medical Center in Durham, North Carolina for Internal Medicine Residency from July 2011 through June 2014; and

WHEREAS, LCDR Lentz's professional memberships include: the American College of Physicians - from 2012 to the present; the American Medical Association - from 2007 to the present; Alpha Omega Alpha - from 2010 to the present; and the Maryland State Medical Society, Medical Student Section - from 2007 to 2009; and
