**Relative to posthumously recognizing the late Francisco Meno Naputi for his contributions and commitment to the communities of San Isidro Catholic Church and Saint Joseph Catholic Church in Inalåhan, Guam; and extending condolences to his family on his passing.**

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF I MINA TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUÅHAN:

WHEREAS, Francisco Meno Naputi was born on January 1, 1932; and is one (1) of the ten (10) children of Enrique Paulino Naputi and Maria Meno Naputi of Inalåhan, Guam; and

WHEREAS, Francisco Meno Naputi helped his parents maintain the village parish regularly, and assisted in setting up the sound system and other logistics required during the annual *Promesa San Jose* honoring the feast of Saint Joseph (the husband of Blessed Mother Mary) which is celebrated throughout the universal Catholic Church on March 19; and *Patrocino San Jose* honoring the feast of Saint Joseph (the worker) which is celebrated on the first weekend of May, and the *tu'kao* (procession) around the village following both celebrations; and

WHEREAS, Francisco Meno Naputi married Anita Castro Chargualaf on October 29, 1953, and were blessed with eleven (11) children: Annie, Jane, Marge, Frankie, Vincent, Paul, Annette, Cris, Kenneth, Rose, and Stephanie; thirty-six (36) grandchildren, and fifty-five (55) great grandchildren; and

WHEREAS, Francisco Meno Naputi and his family moved to *Malofoj Inalåhan* in October of 1977 where he continued to help respond to the needs of his church community by serving as a member of the *San Isidro* Church choir, assisting with logistics set-up during the annual *San Isidro* fiesta celebration, and coordinating fundraising events to help build the parish rectory, social hall, and outdoor stage areas; and

WHEREAS, Francisco Meno Naputi's commitment to serve his village parishes began at a young age as an altar server and volunteer for *San Isidro* Catholic Church and Saint Joseph Catholic Church in *Inalåhan*, Guam; and he gave his love and generosity to the communities for many years; and

WHEREAS, in the early 1970s, Francisco Meno Naputi served as a member of the Saint Joseph Parish Council and was instrumental in coordinating fundraisers to help renovate various church facilities which were in dire need of repairs; and with the help of children and residents from across *Inalåhan*, Francisco Meno Naputi prepared the electrical system for the fiesta booths and the outdoor stage which served as the venue for *CHamoru* music, comedy skits such as *Eskuelan Pale'* and *General Hospital*, and other performances during the *Patrocino San Jose* fiesta; and

WHEREAS, in addition to helping Saint Joseph Catholic Church with preparations for village fiestas, Francisco Meno Naputi volunteered as an organist with the church choir – sharing a talent he learned from his father during childhood; and

WHEREAS, through most of his life, Francisco Meno Naputi stepped up to the plate without request and served his church communities in different leadership roles, such as Chairperson of the Saint Joseph Cemetery Council, representative member of the *San Isidro* Parish, and member of the Knights of Columbus; and

WHEREAS, following eighteen (18) years of service with Pacific Telestations, Inc., dba KUAM, which included participating in the company's fiftieth (50<sup>th</sup>) year anniversary on Guam, and his retirement from the Guam Department of Education thereafter, Francisco Meno Naputi spent much of his time sharing his talents in music, arts and crafts, cooking, and hospitality with residents, school children, and tourists as a member of the *Gof Pa'go* team where he led tours of Historic *Inalåhan* and demonstrations in rope-making, *salinas* (salt-making), and *katuput* (rice pack), and

WHEREAS, Francisco Meno Naputi lived his life in every way possible to exemplify his faith in God, his love for family, and his service to others; now therefore, be it

RESOLVED, that the Committee on Rules of I Mina'trentai Singko Na Liheslaturan Guåhan does hereby, on behalf of I Liheslaturan Guåhan and the People of Guam, posthumously recognize the late Francisco Meno Naputi for his contributions and commitment to the communities of *San Isidro* Catholic Church and Saint Joseph Catholic Church in *Inalåhan*, Guam; and extend condolences to his family on his passing; and be it further




