BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMITTEE ON RULES OF *I MINA'TRENTAI SINGKO NA LIHESLATURAN GUAHAN*:

WHEREAS, Carlos Lizama Taitano Elementary School was first established in 1958, and was originally known as *Sinajaña* Elementary School. On September 27, 1970, the school was formally dedicated as "Carlos Lizama Taitano Elementary School," more commonly known as C.L. Taitano Elementary School, and was renamed by law to honor the public servant and civic leader. The school community of Carlos L. Taitano Elementary School values the historical chronology of the establishment of *Sinajaña* Elementary School in 1958, and the renaming of the school to Carlos L. Taitano Elementary School on September 27, 1970; and

WHEREAS, Carlos Lizama Taitano was born on November 5, 1932 in *Hagåtña*, Guam; and is the son of Carlos Flores Taitano and Joaquina Crisostomo Lizama. Carlos Taitano attended elementary school in the villages of *Dededo*, *Hagåtña*, and *Agaña Heights* and graduated from George Washington High School in 1952. Carlos Taitano was the eldest of seven (7) children, who always took care of his siblings and was like a father figure to them and inspired them to study hard. He was a caring, kind, and hard-working individual who always kept in close contact with his family; and his co-workers regarded him with high praise and considered him to be a fair man. He loved reading and especially loved reading comic books, and carried them in his pocket, which he took out to read whenever he could. Carlos Taitano was a man who valued the importance of education, and he went on to earn a Bachelor's degree in Finance from San Francisco State College on June 15, 1959. He was active civically serving as a member and Chairman of the Guam Territorial Board of Education (now the Guam Education Board); he founded Post No. 41 of the American Legion on Guam; he was a member of the Guam Recreation Commission, the *Sinajaña* Civic Improvement Club, and the *Sinajaña* Parent Teachers Association; and he was inducted into the *Phi Delta Kappa* International - Guam Educator's Hall of Fame on May 15, 1994; and


