WHEREAS, the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port (Port) was established as a public corporation and autonomous government agency by the enactment of Public Law 13-87 in October 1975; and

WHEREAS, over the last forty-four (44) years, the Port has developed into a major transshipment center for the western Pacific region, providing full services to ocean passenger, cargo and fishing vessels; and

WHEREAS, the Port continues to build upon its core competencies and resiliency by improving and expanding its modernization efforts through operational efficiencies, maximizing its capacity, enhancing its security and monitoring systems, and consistently providing excellent services to island residents, the private sector, and federal and U.S. Department of Defense entities; and

WHEREAS, in its continuing efforts to improve its facilities and long-term sustainability, the Port has acquired and leveraged grant funding to: (1) update its 2013 Master Plan; (2) develop the conceptual planning and scope of work for the A&E design services for the Port's new Administration Building Annex; (3) conduct feasibility studies for a Deep Draft Wharf and Fill Improvement project; (4) conduct feasibility studies for the Guam Customs Inspection Facility; (5) perform additional Port Police security upgrades; (6) acquire a new Prime Power generator for the Port's Load Center 3; (7) replace existing analog cameras with digital IP cameras for its CCTV monitoring system; (8) repaint existing Concrete Masonry Unit (CMU) wall and gate booths, and replace existing barbed wires on security fencing; and (9) purchase four (4) new top lifters; and

WHEREAS, on September 19, 2019, the Port, in collaboration with the U.S. Department of Transportation Maritime Administration (MARAD), recently executed the Grant Agreement for the Hotel Wharf Rehabilitation and Access Roadway Repair project that obligated Ten Million Dollars (\$10,000,000) acquired through MARAD's Transportation Investment Generating Economic Recovery (TIGER) grant; and the renovation is expected to break ground early next year; and

WHEREAS, the Port continues to move forward with approximately Seventy-one Million Four Hundred Fifty Thousand Dollars (\$71,450,000) of its revenue bonds to fund ten (10) major capital improvement projects: (1) refurbish and upgrade H-Wharf; (2) repairs to Golf Pier; (3) waterline relocation and replacement; (4) renovate the Equipment and Maintenance Repair (EQMR) Building; (5) renovate and repair Warehouse 1 Building; (6) construct an Administrative Annex Building and refurbish the existing Administration Building; (7) repairs to F1 Fuel Pier; (8) repairs to F3, F4, F5, and F6 Piers; (9) installation of a connectivity fuel line connecting Golf Pier and F-1 Fuel Pier; and (10) upgrade to the Port's Information Technology System and Integration of the Terminal Operating System and Financial Management System; and

WHEREAS, the employees, management, and Board of Directors of the Jose D. Leon Guerrero Commercial Port remain committed to sustaining the island and the region, and continue taking on the challenges of modernizing the Port to meet the ever-changing needs of the island's economic growth; now therefore, be it
